Janitorial Space Type: Addendum – Biohazard Clean

<b>Purpose:</b> Ensuring proper procedures are followed throughout a bio hazard situation and that people and environment are protected and impacted areas are appropriately cleaned and disinfected.	

**Biohazard Clean - A procedure used to clean a biohazard organism, or substance derived from an organism, that poses a threat to (primarily) human health. This cleaning procedure may include the cleaning and disinfecting of medical waste, organic material (blood, vomit, and feces), virus or toxin (from a biological source) that could impact human health.**

	SCHEDULED CLEANING PROCEDURES	Level of service to be anticipated directly following a scheduled clean.
1.1	<b>Secure spill area</b>	Spill area is taped off and “Wet Floor or Out of Order” signs set up.
1.2	<b>Personal Protective Equipment worn when required</b> may include gloves, eye protection, tyvek booties and respirator if required.	All cleaners to wear Personal Protective Equipment when cleaning bio hazardous materials to limit cross contamination of other non-contaminated areas
1.3	<b>Protect and Cover</b> any carpeted and uncontaminated surfaces areas next to the contaminated area	Carpets and or uncontaminated surfaces are covered and protected during clean-up of contaminated areas to limit cross contamination.
1.4	<b>Spill area cleaned of visible organic bio hazardous material</b> (blood, vomit, feces) before applying any disinfectant. Absorbent material distributed on spill area. Left to sit until the majority of the liquid absorbed	All surfaces are free of organic bio hazardous material and absorbent material used before being disinfected
1.5	<b>Glass, needles, other sharp objects</b> , or any other items that may be contaminated placed into a sharps container.	All sharps, glass or other contaminated objects removed and placed in appropriate container for disposal
1.6	<b>Sweep</b> spent absorbent material. Place all debris into the proper disposable garbage bag..	All absorbent material cleaned and disposed of appropriately
1.7	<b>Spray/ wet</b> the contaminated area with disinfectant and let stand for appropriate time identified by manufacturer	Appropriate disinfectant applied to all contaminated areas
1.8	<b>Disinfect walls and floors by</b> wiping the walls and floors with disposable towels	Walls and floors disinfected and present an overall clean appearance

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<b>1.9</b>	<b>Decontaminate the equipment and tools</b> used for clean- up – decontaminate using clean water and appropriate disinfectant. Remove and safely dispose of PPE equipment.	All tools and equipment associated with bio hazard clean will be disinfected and/or disposed of in appropriate containers
<b>1.10</b>	<b>Dispose and Remove all garbage</b> to the large waste disposal Bins or containers immediately after decontamination.	All waste will be removed and disposed of in an appropriate manner.
