Ford Mountain Correctional Centre (FMCC) opened in 1966 as an open custody facility. Today, FMCC is a men's multi-level security centre primarily for aboriginal men, offenders with a mental disorder and sexual offenders. We employ officers who encourage an environment of positive change and personal growth. This is supported by modeling positive behaviour, effective case management, targeted core programs, varied work opportunities and vocational skill development.

Types of staff positions:

- » **Living Unit:** supervises inmates housed in dorm-like residences
- » **Control:** operates security and communications systems to ensure safety and security
- » **Work Programs:** supervises inmates who are providing community work services and developing practical job skills
- » **Inmate Programs:** facilitates programs that prepares offenders for re-integration into society
- » **Escort:** supervises and provides security to inmates who are required to attend the community

Features:

- » Located in a stunning outdoor setting among mountains and the beautiful Chilliwack River
- » Healthy and natural work environment
- » Excellent staff mentoring program, wellness and social committees
- » Supportive team leaders who encourage continuous learning and development

Quick facts:

- » The facility houses approximately 125 adult male offenders
- » Our offender population includes those serving less than two years and classified as open or medium custody
- » FMCC specializes in mentally disordered and sex offender management
- » Staff complement: 45 full and part-time employees

Basic employee requirements — you:

- » have a strong sense of integrity and excellent communication skills
- » are 19 years or older
- » are a Canadian citizen or permanent resident
- » possess a valid B.C. class 5 driver's licence
- » have Grade 12 or equivalent

Steps of the employment application process:

1. Online application: fill out and submit an online application and recruitment questionnaire
2. Interview: if suitable, you will be contacted to schedule an interview
3. Screenings: participate in a set of screenings, including physical abilities (COPAT), language proficiency (LPI), computer voice stress analysis (CVSA), vision and medical tests
4. Background checks: include references, credit checks and a criminal record search
5. First aid: have or obtain valid first aid (OFA) certification
