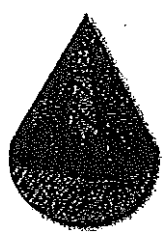

2. Please give a brief description of new initiatives implemented by school districts for French second language programs.

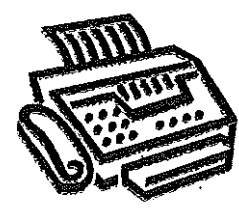
The French Monitor was hired for an additional year to work in a support role with small groups of French Immersion students to encourage and improve oral language skills.

A pilot using AIM strategies and resources was implemented in a small number of FSL and French Immersion classes. Based on their success, the program will be expanded to additional classes next year.

The secondary French Immersion teacher began using I-Pods with the grade 11 and 12 students to help strengthen their oral language skills. This will be expanded to grade 10 next year.
