2. Please give a brief description of new initiatives implemented by school districts for French second language programs.

We have been working to sustain enrolment in secondary immersion programs and have been active in implementing Transition activities for French Immersion students and teachers between elementary, middle, and secondary schools. We have planned fun and educational activities for our elementary and middle students whereby they come to the high school for special presentations, group activities, etc. This is a way for them to get to know their high school better before they come and also to see that it is not too difficult for them to maintain being in a French immersion program.

We have also offered the DELF program exams to any interested grade 11 and 12 student for free in order to have them gain confidence in their abilities in French and to let the students know the value of having proficiency in French for their future.

We have also tried to encourage the use of technology in the French classrooms in order to bring the language into the classroom and make it more real for the students. This is especially true of CORE French programs in the elementary schools in which the teachers delivering the curriculum may not be comfortable with the language themselves.

We provided workshops in French for Full Day K and K/1 programs at our Kindergarten Conference in the Fall of 2010 in order to assist teachers to prepare for Full Day K in French Immersion.

3. Please give a brief description of planned expenditures by school districts for carried over federal funds for school year 2011/2012.

As we are a decentralized district in terms of budgets, we will continue to allocate most of the federal funding provided directly to schools on a per pupil basis. Any funds that were not spent this year were allocated directly to the schools and many of the smaller schools were waiting to combine their funds from this year with next year to purchase larger cost items such as LCD projectors and technology for French. The majority of the schools used their funding to purchase learning resources and will be doing so again next year with any funds carried forward.

At the District level, we will continue to fund training for the DELF program for late summer 2011 as we committed to interested teachers in the spring of 2010 that we would do so, so we did save some funds for this.

We will continue to encourage schools to use more technology to enhance the learning and real world experiences and opportunities for students and this will continue to be an ongoing focus for our district.
