

We have also maintained our two French coordinator positions with a 0.4 FTE. One teacher is responsible for FSL K to 12 and the other is in charge of French Immersion K to 12. These teachers provide great service to staff by organizing in-service sessions, presenting and modeling a variety of teaching strategies and sharing resources. They also organize meetings which allow teachers the opportunity to cooperate and collaborate

Furthermore, this year, we have cooperated with Simon Fraser University and are offering our teachers the possibility to take part in a diploma program tailor made to respond to our teachers' needs. This is scheduled to be offered in the 2011-2012 school year.

We have had a French Monitor and were able to support their activities and special initiatives with our funds.

2. Please give a brief description of new initiatives implemented by school districts for French second language programs.

This year we have had an exciting iPod pilot project at one of our secondary schools. We purchased a class set of iPods for Cedar Secondary and the teacher researched applications which would be useful for students in the secondary FSL program. A great many applications were found to be most appropriate. Students found they actually enjoyed doing grammar exercises on their iPods! Another popular application was the one pertaining to francophone music and songs. This project was highly successful and generated much

enthusiasm from the students. The teachers involved made a presentation to the Board of Education and the trustees had so much fun using the devices that they reluctantly gave them back at the end of the presentation. As a result, we will be purchasing a second set of iPods for another secondary school this year.

We have just purchased a class set of iPads complete with cart and projector. These devices will be housed at the District Resources Center and will be available to French Immersion Schools who will be borrowing them on a rotational basis. We have a plan for rolling them out and for providing Professional Development to teachers. There will be an in-service session, a train the trainer type of PD on August 19<sup>th</sup> and some representatives from our district will attend. This in turn will prepare them to be able to provide in-service to the rest of the teachers.

3. Please give a brief description of planned expenditures by school districts for carried over federal funds for school year 2011/2012.

Our district has undertaken two major reviews this year, the IBM Technology Review and the French Immersion Review.

At this time, the IBM Technology Review Team has presented their findings as well as their recommendations to our Board of Education and we have re-activated our Educational Technology Advisory Committee. This means that by using some of our carried over/reserve funds, we will be able to put into practice some of the recommendations.

The French Immersion Review findings will be shared with the Board of Education this fall. We know that Late French Immersion and Facilities concerns are part of this review. The draft report suggests that SD68 might consider changing the current French Immersion organization to a new organization. If this is adopted by the board, it will mean providing additional resources. Again, our carry over funding will be essential in helping us meet the goals of and suggestions in the report.
