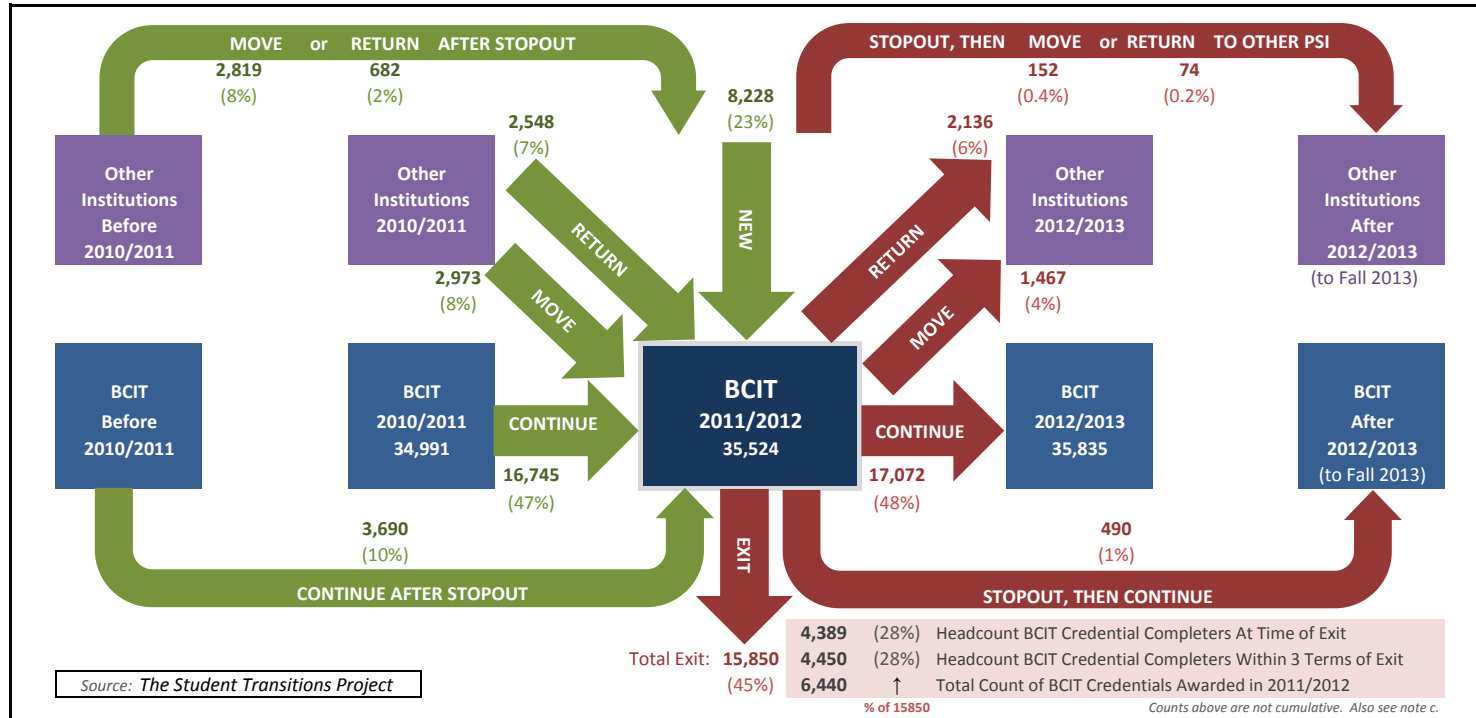

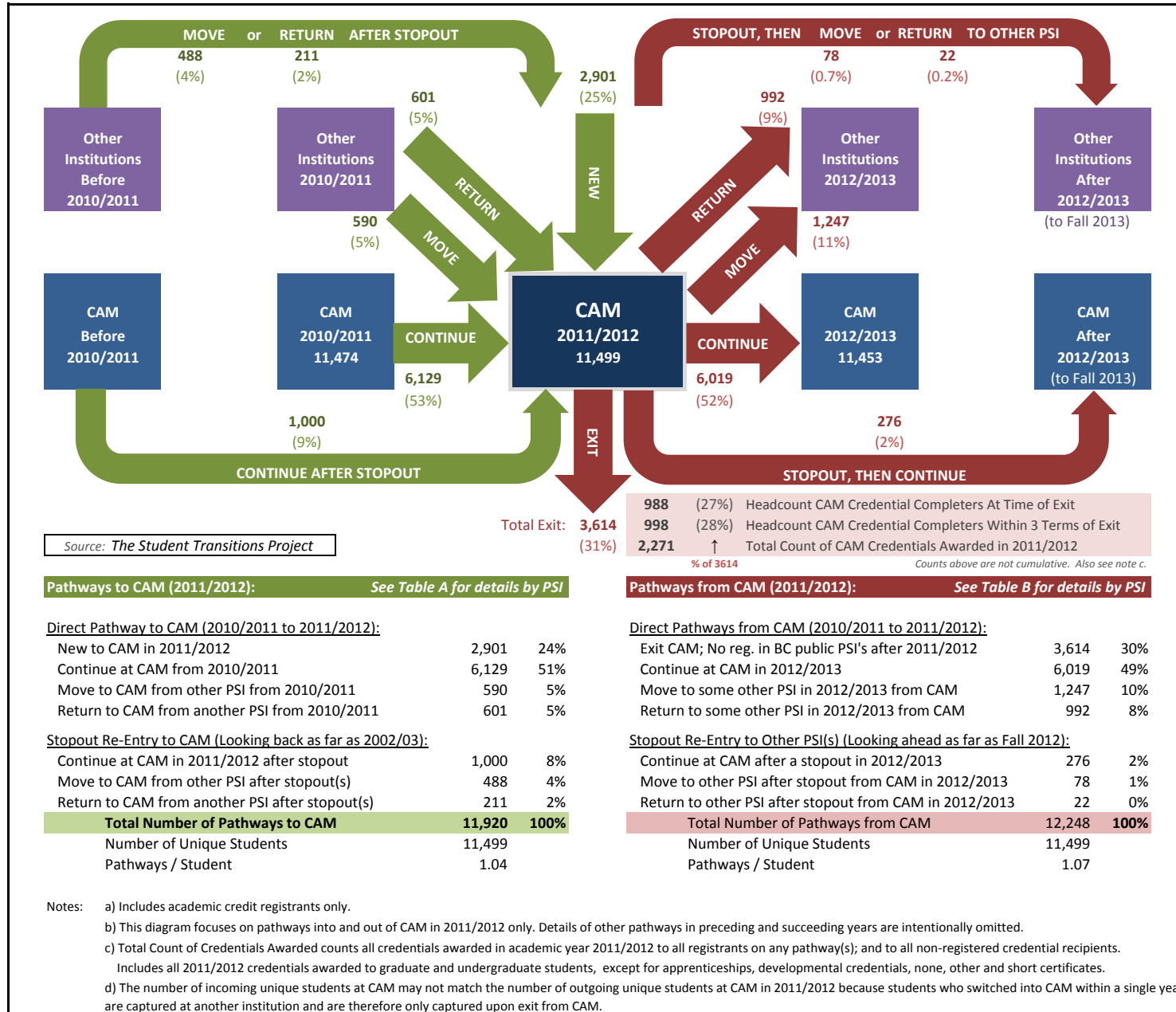

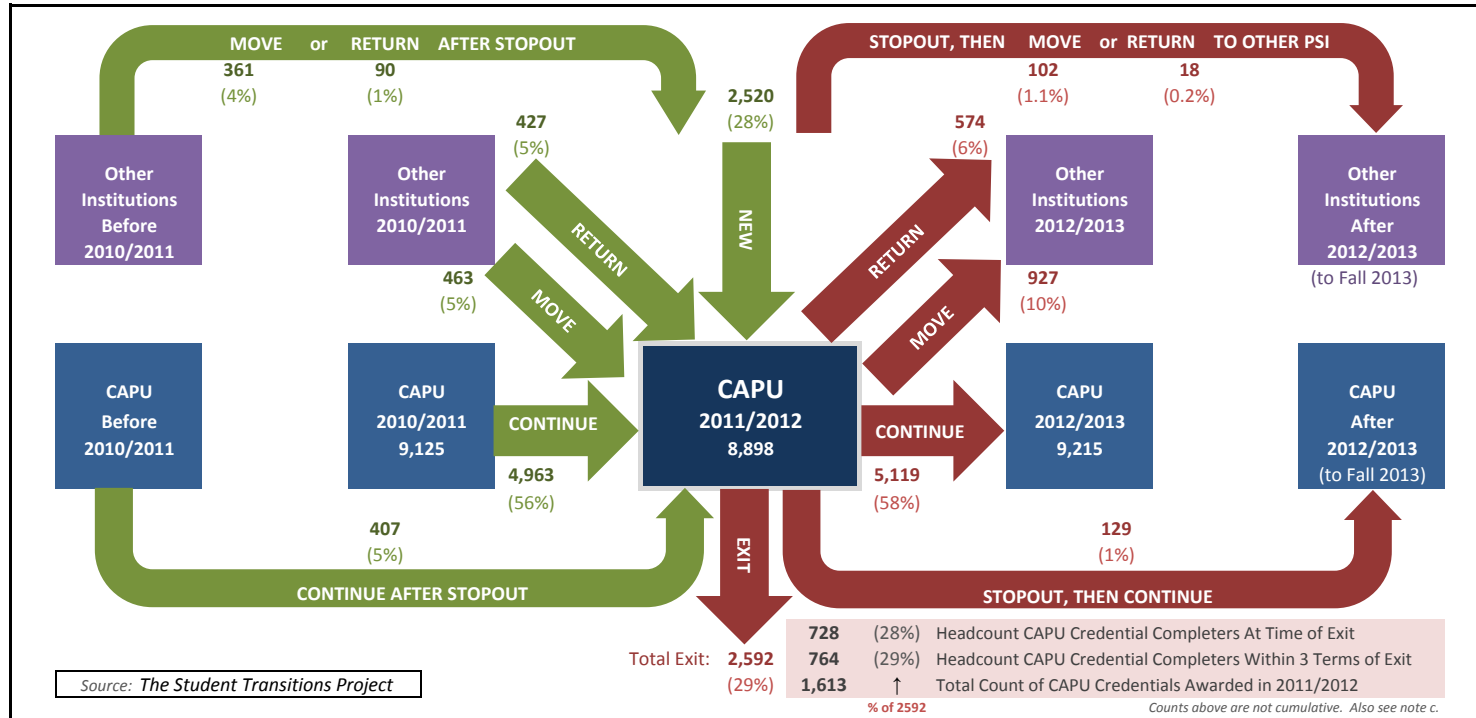

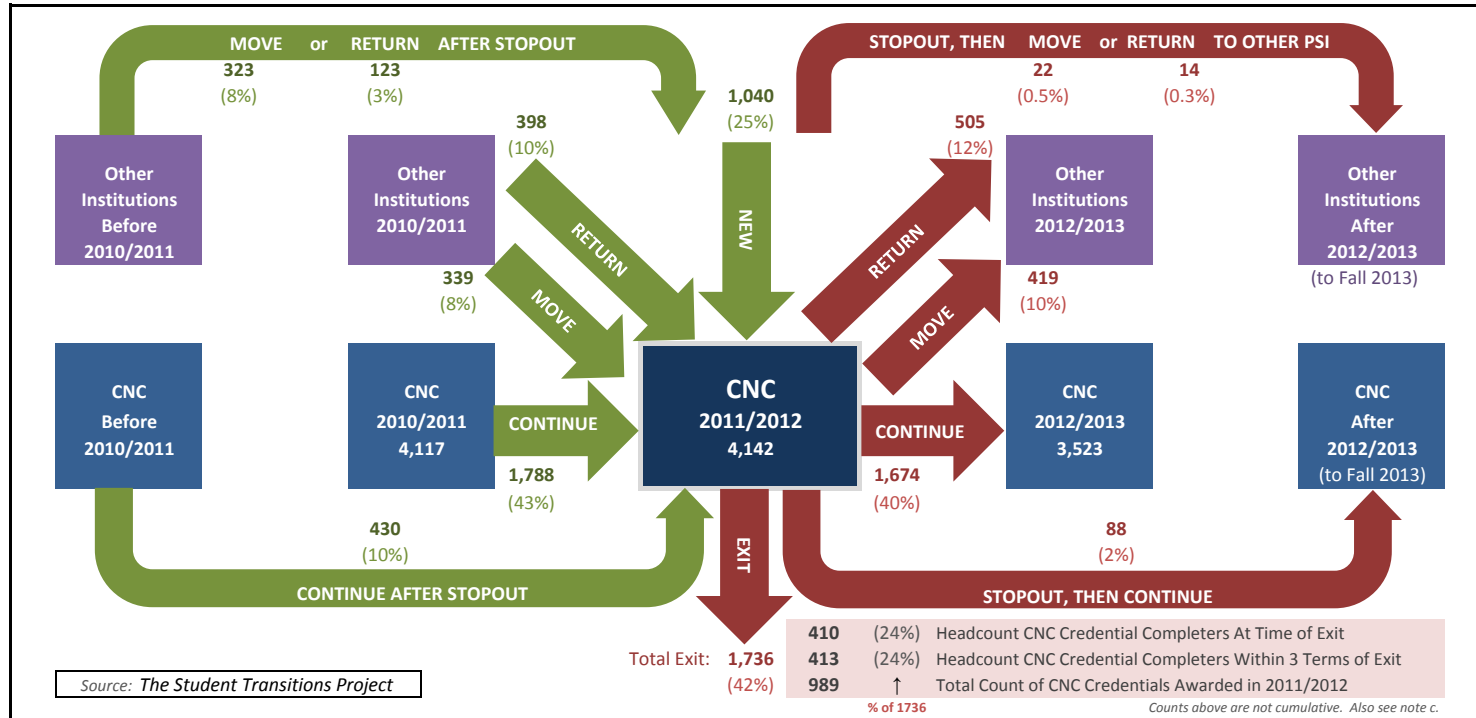

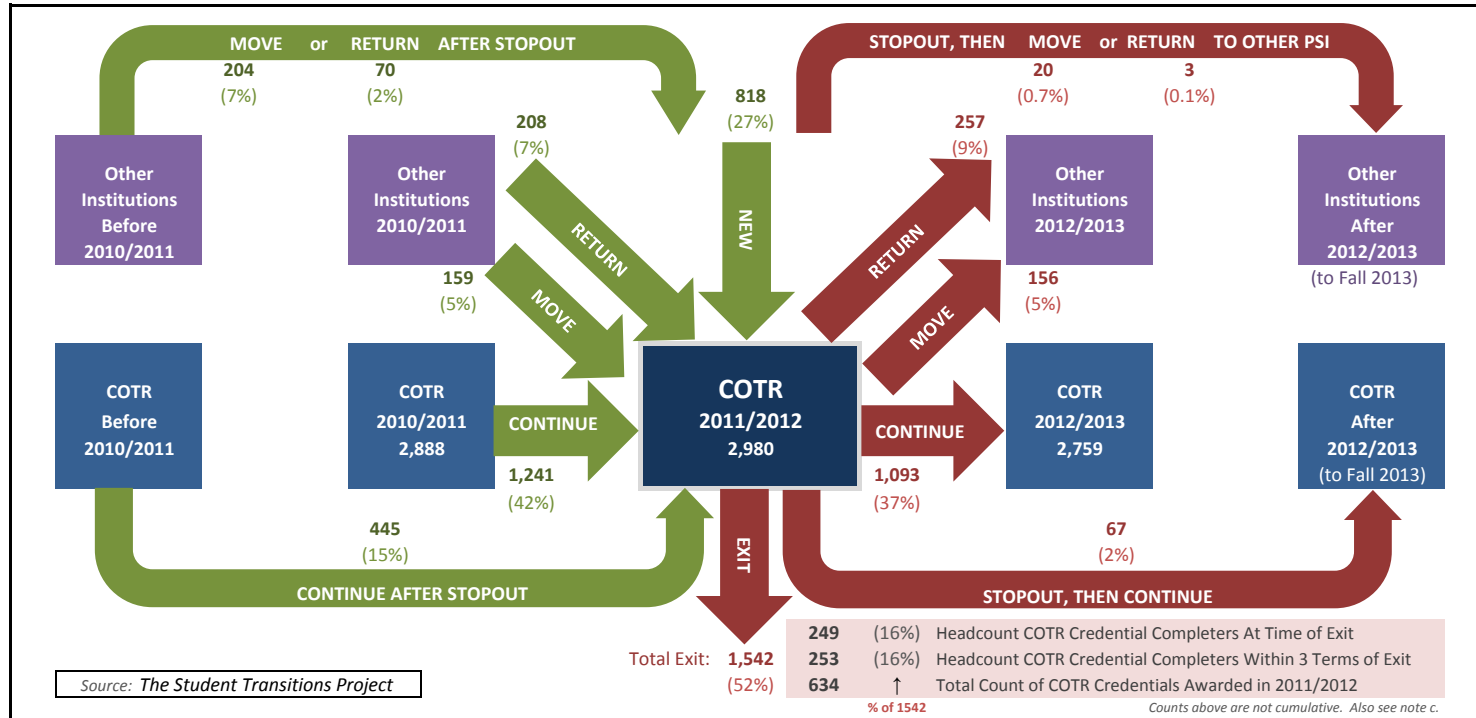

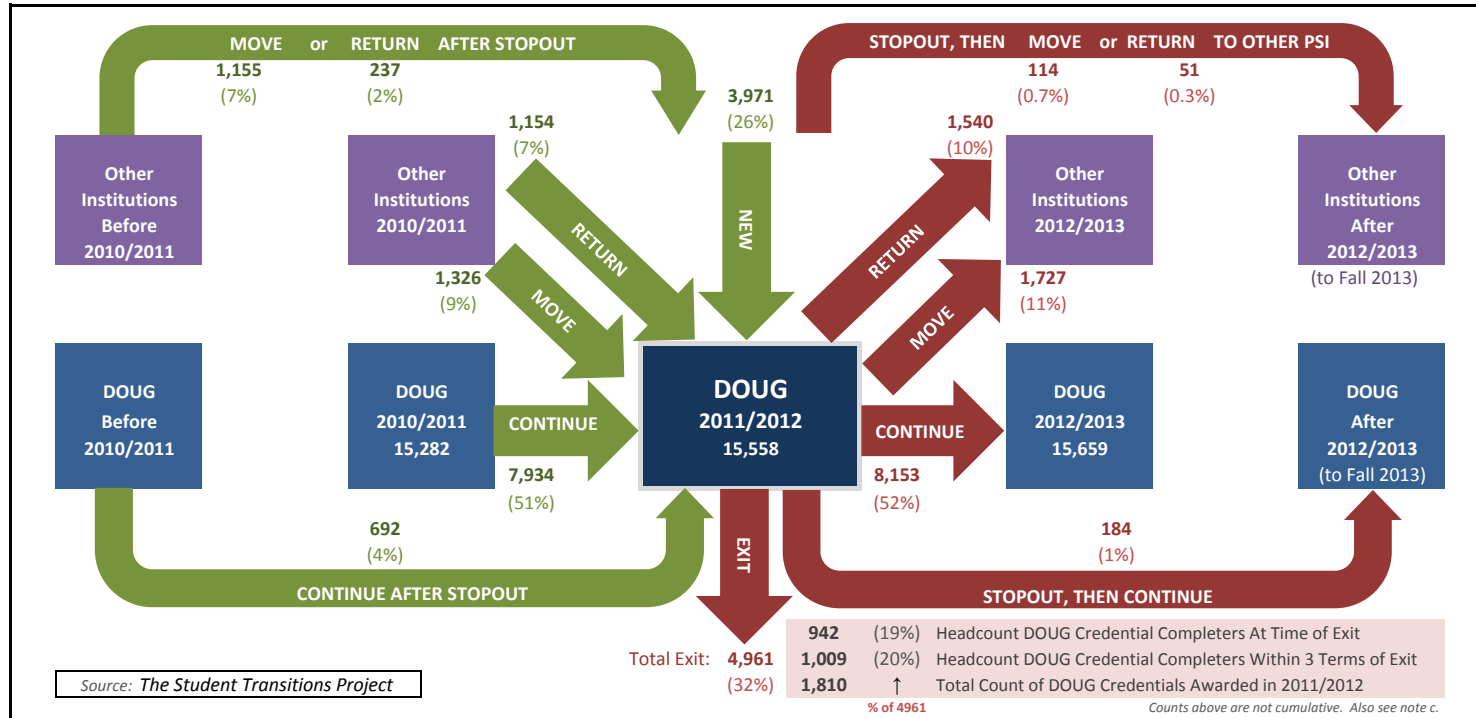

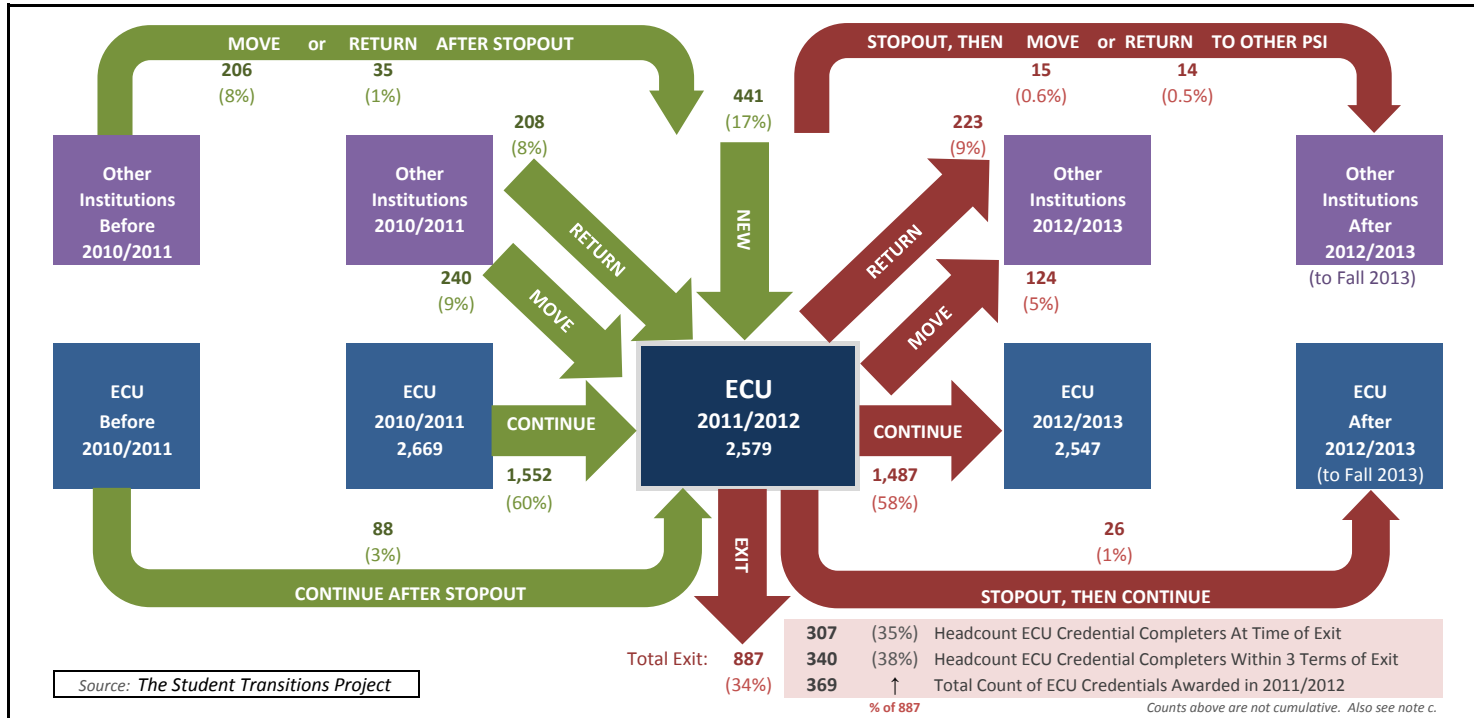

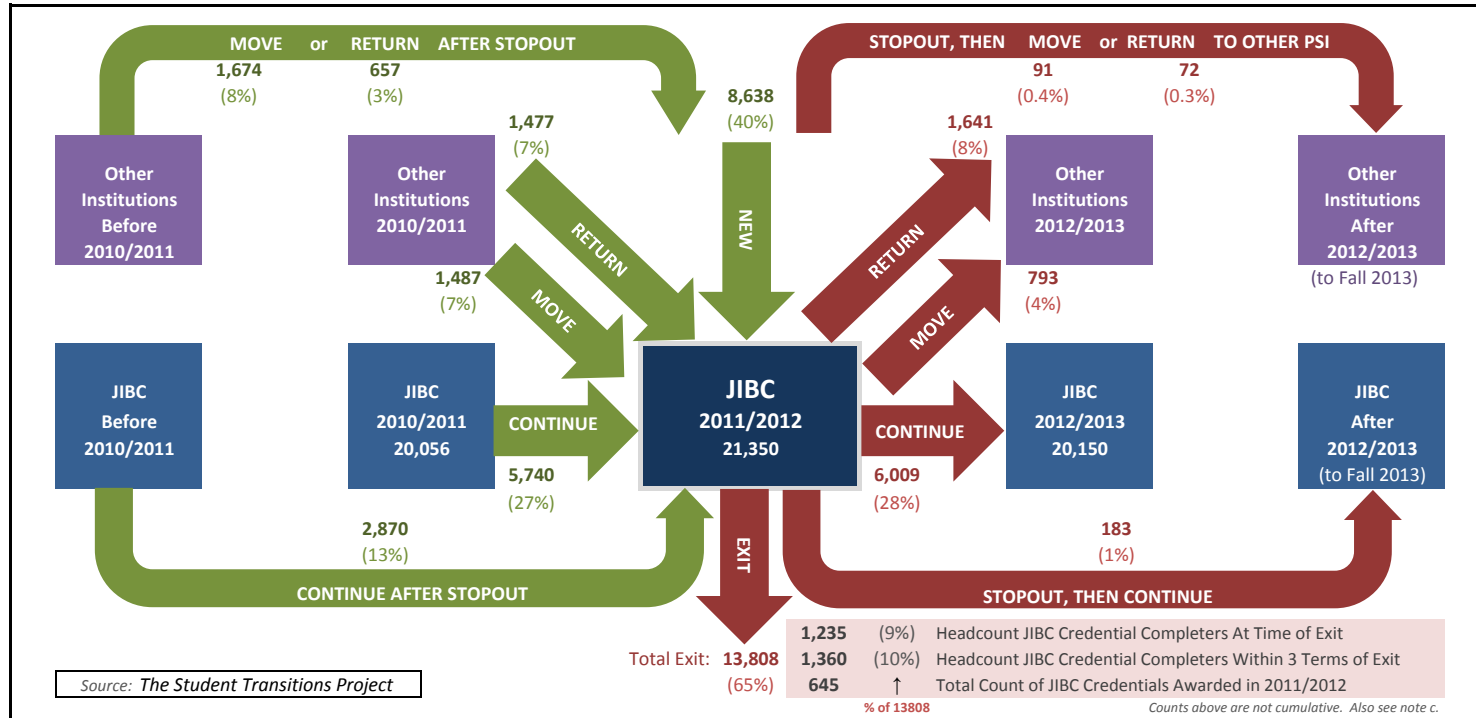

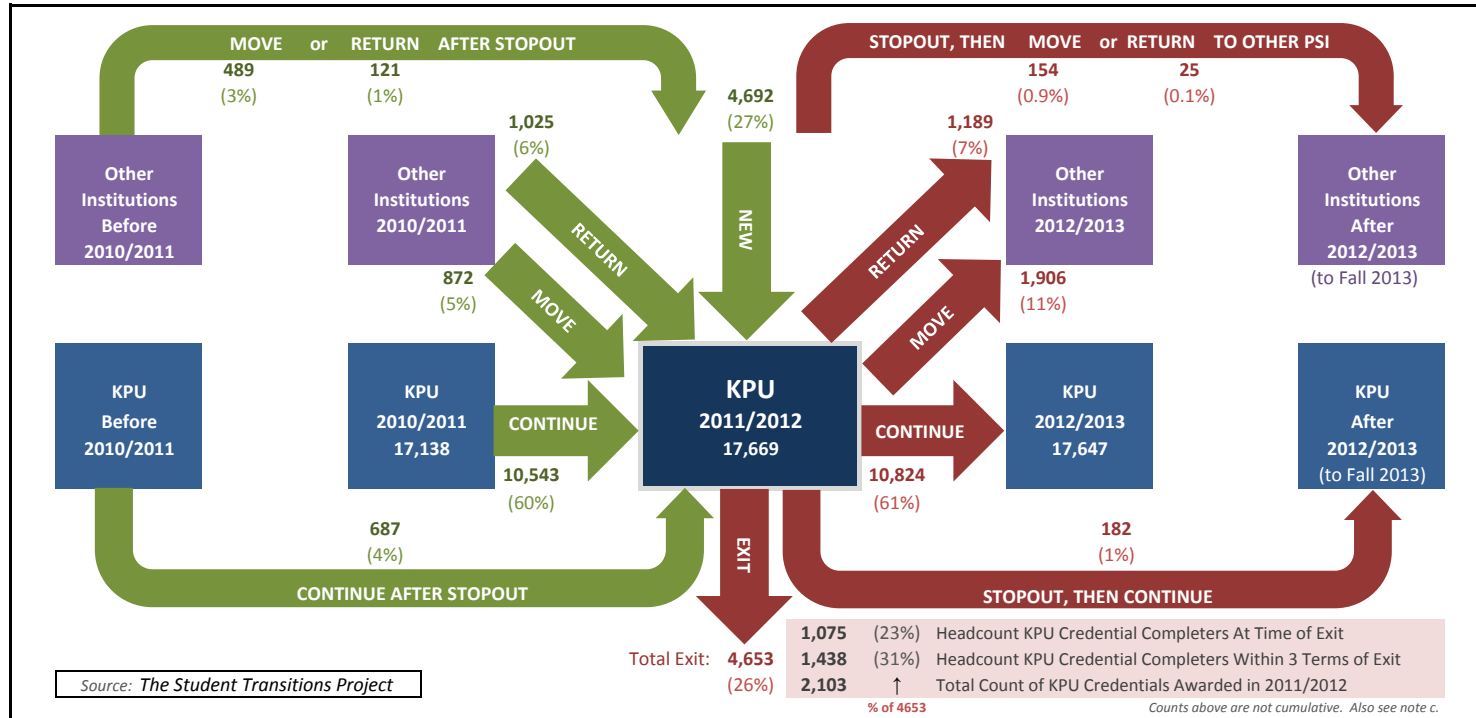

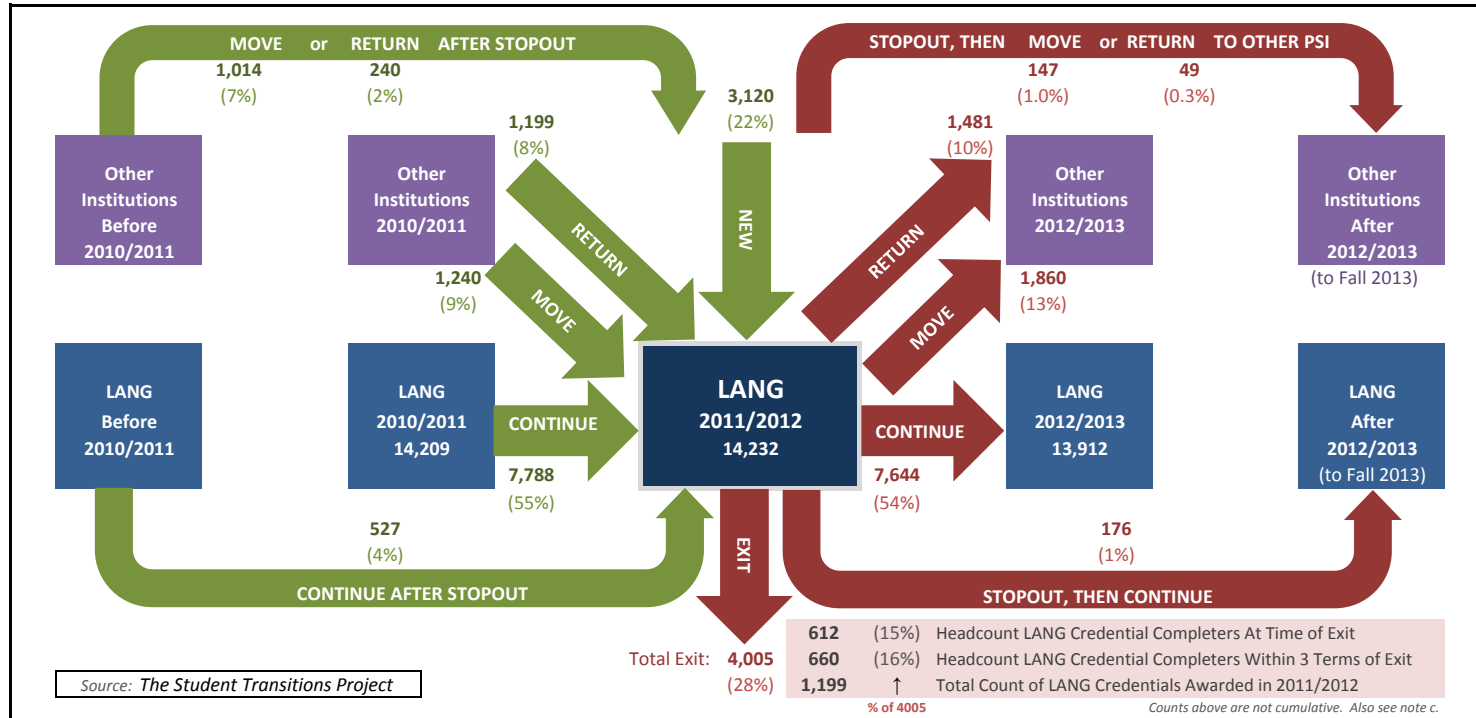

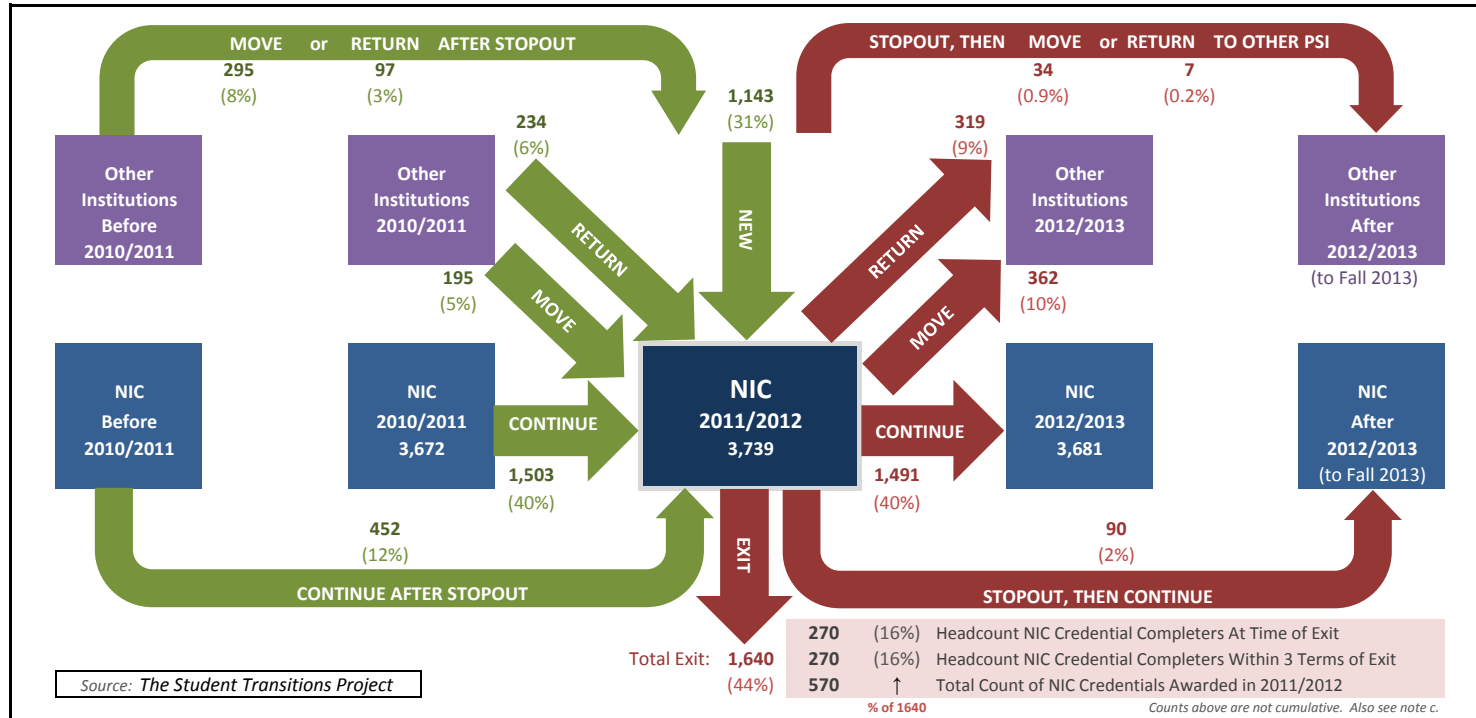

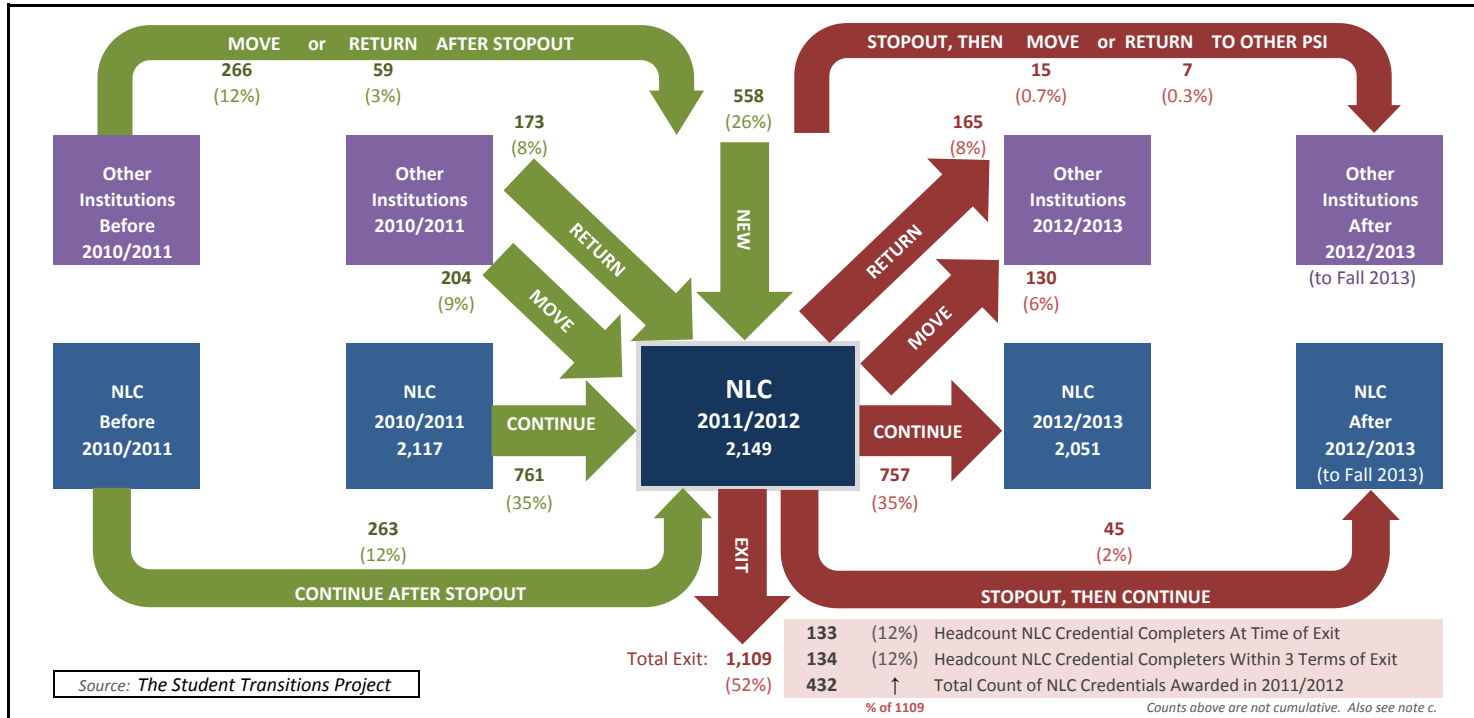

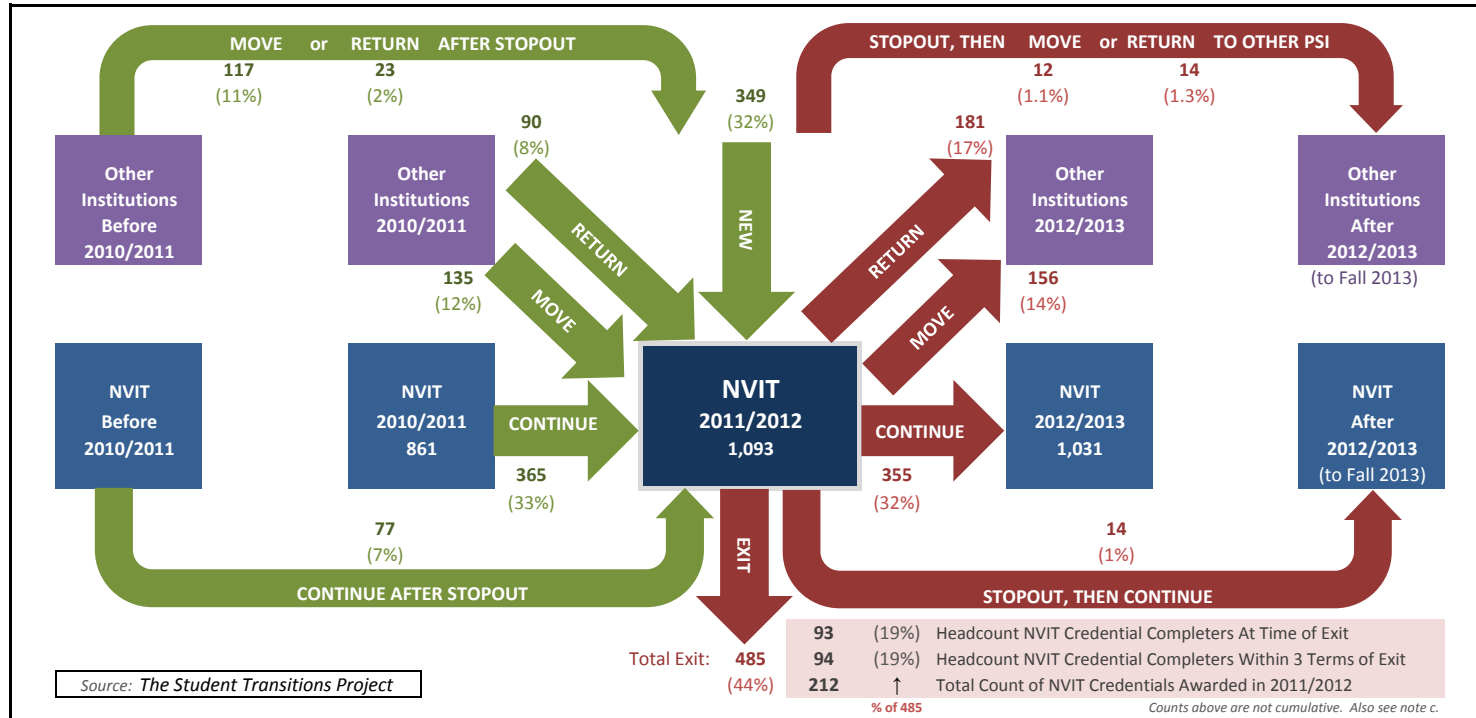

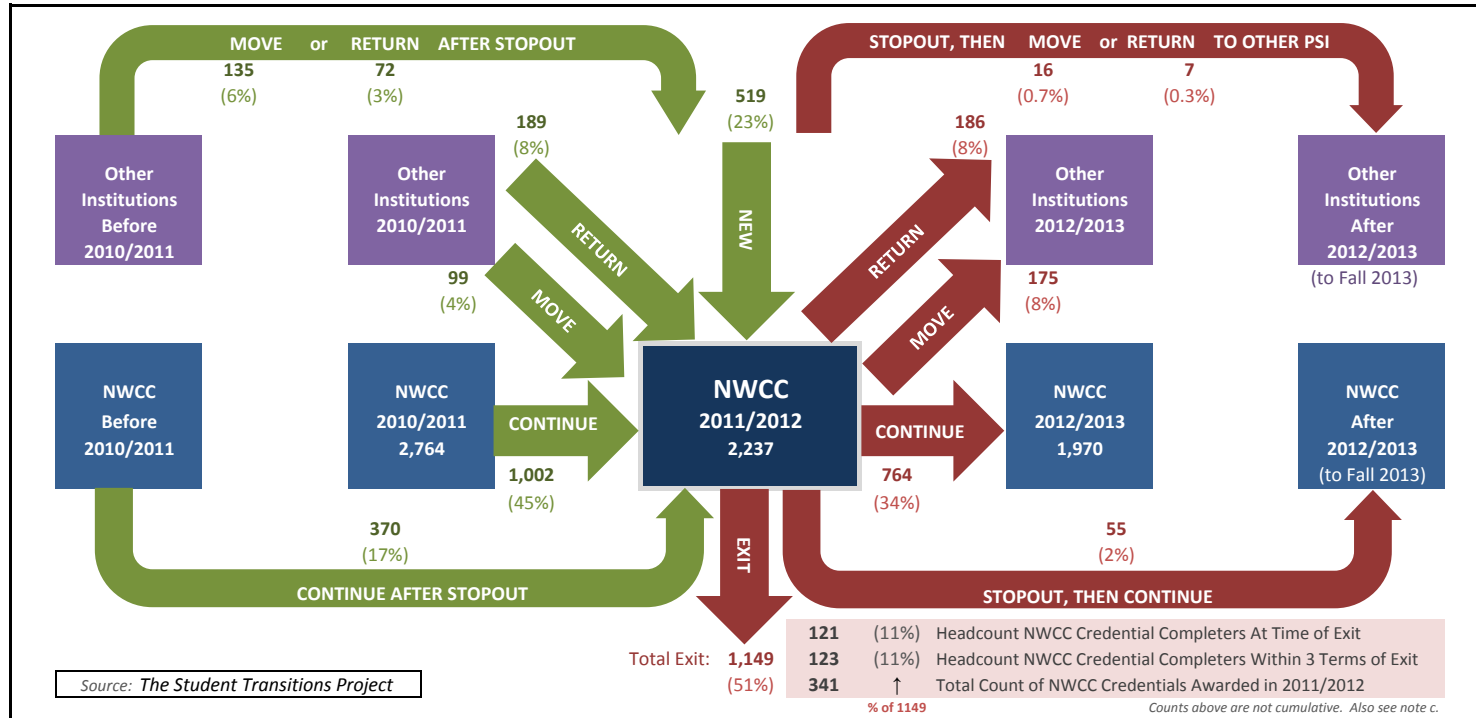

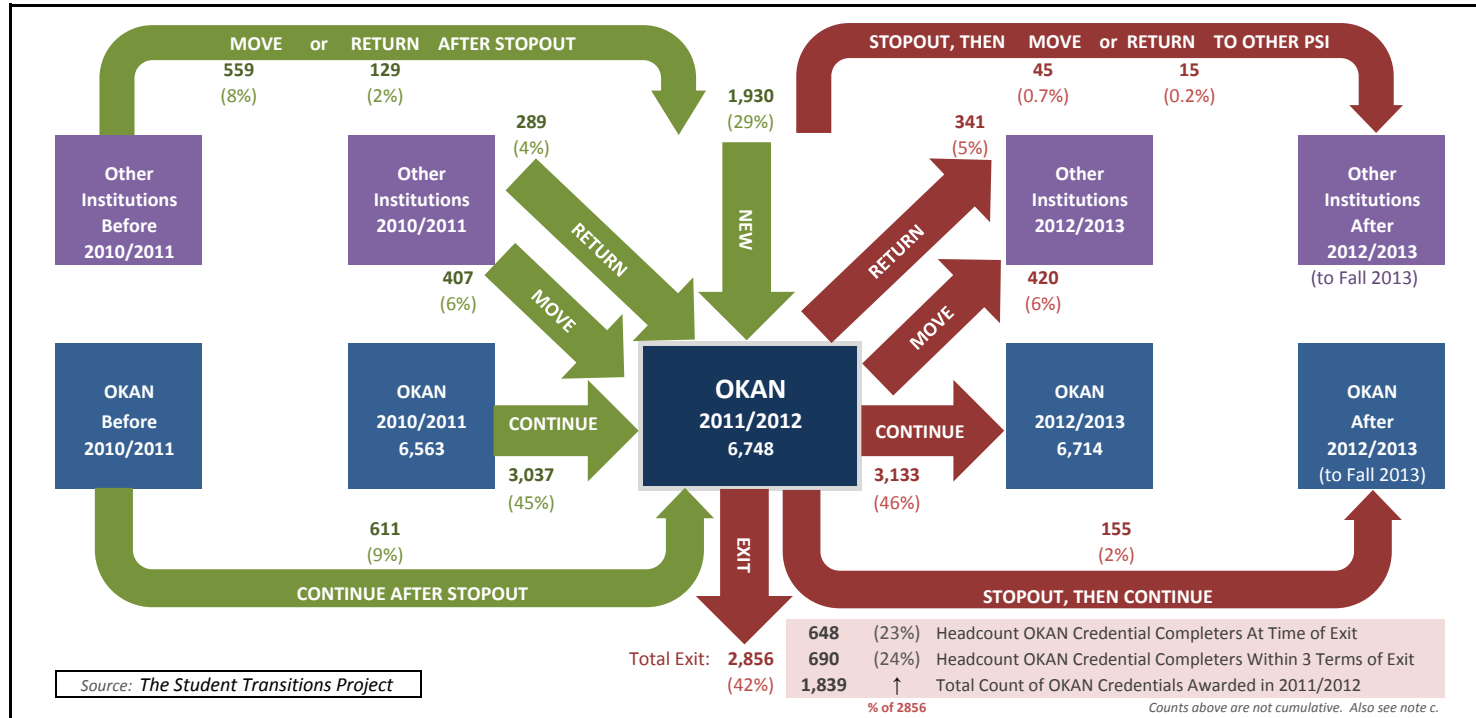

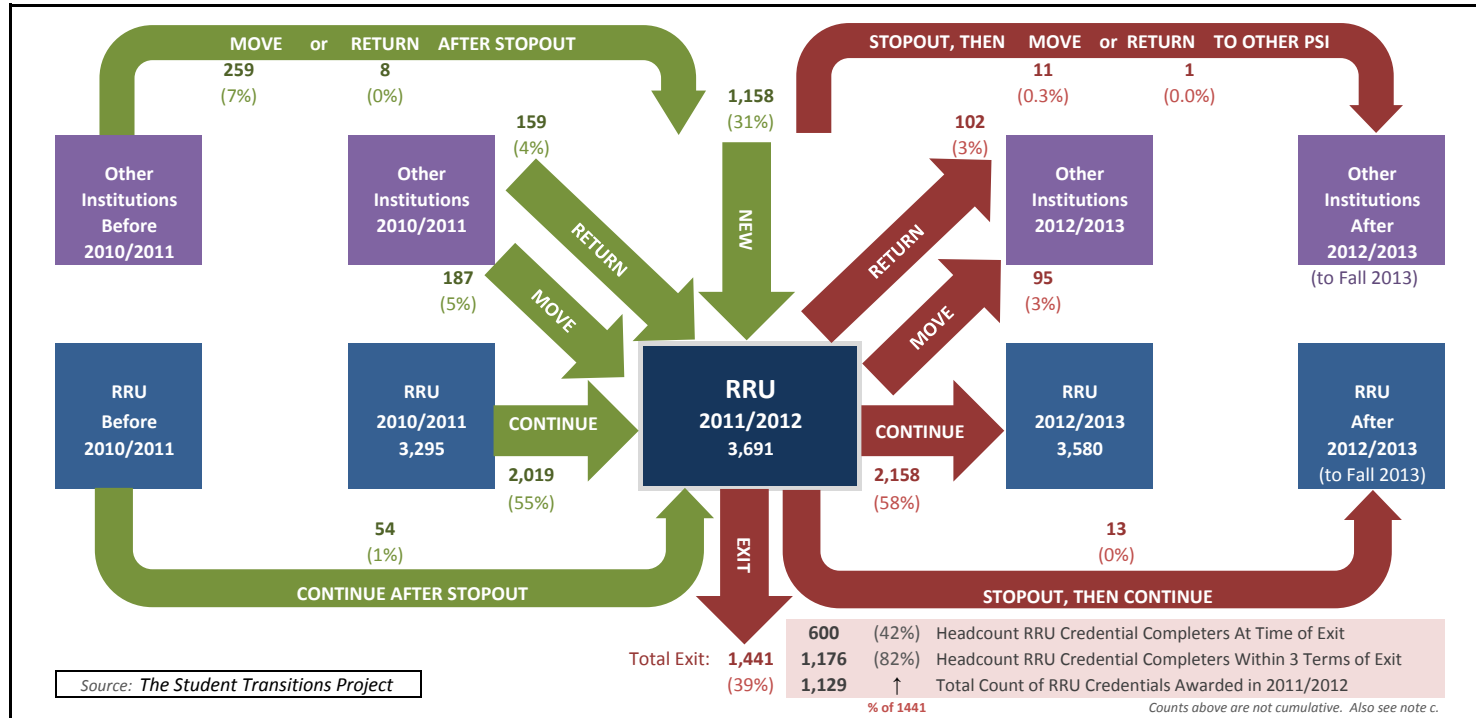

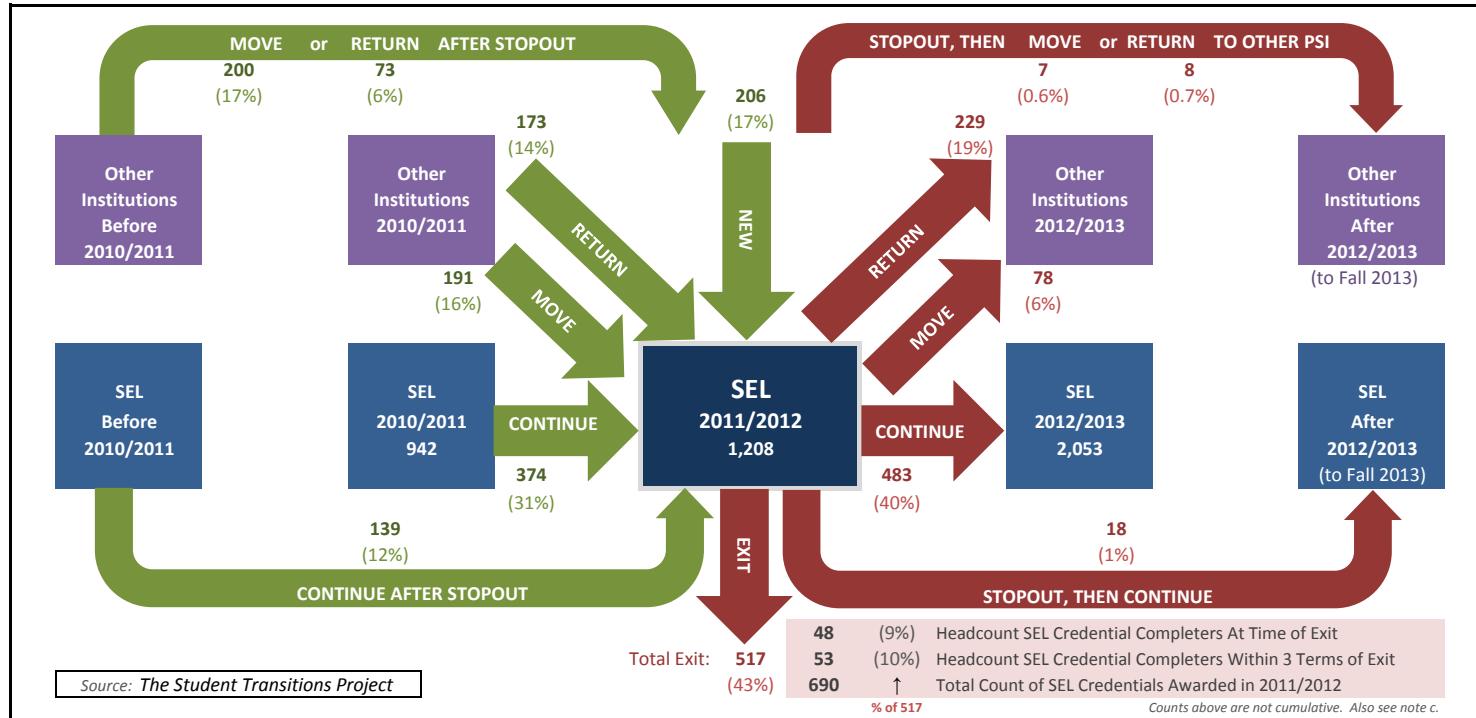

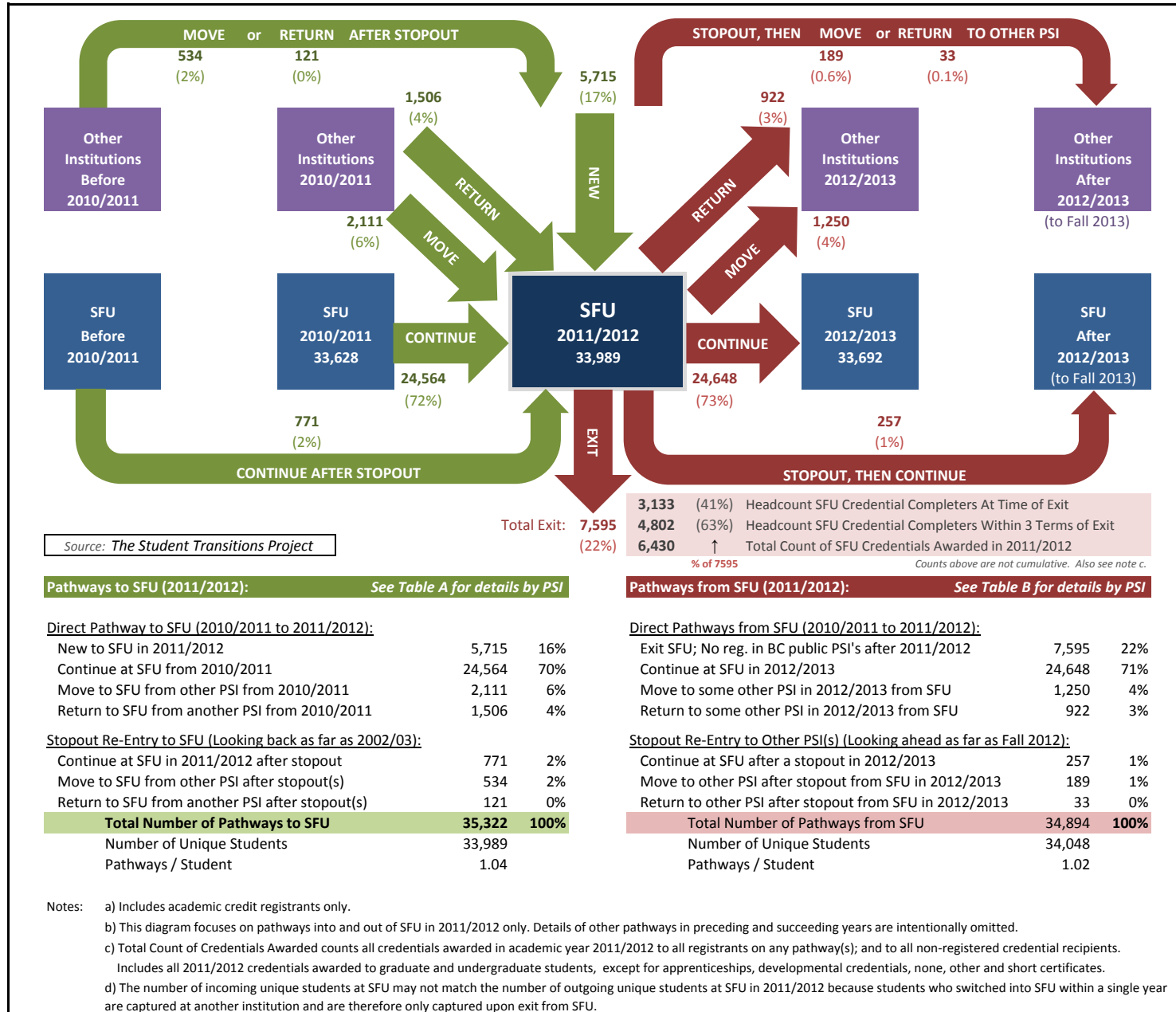

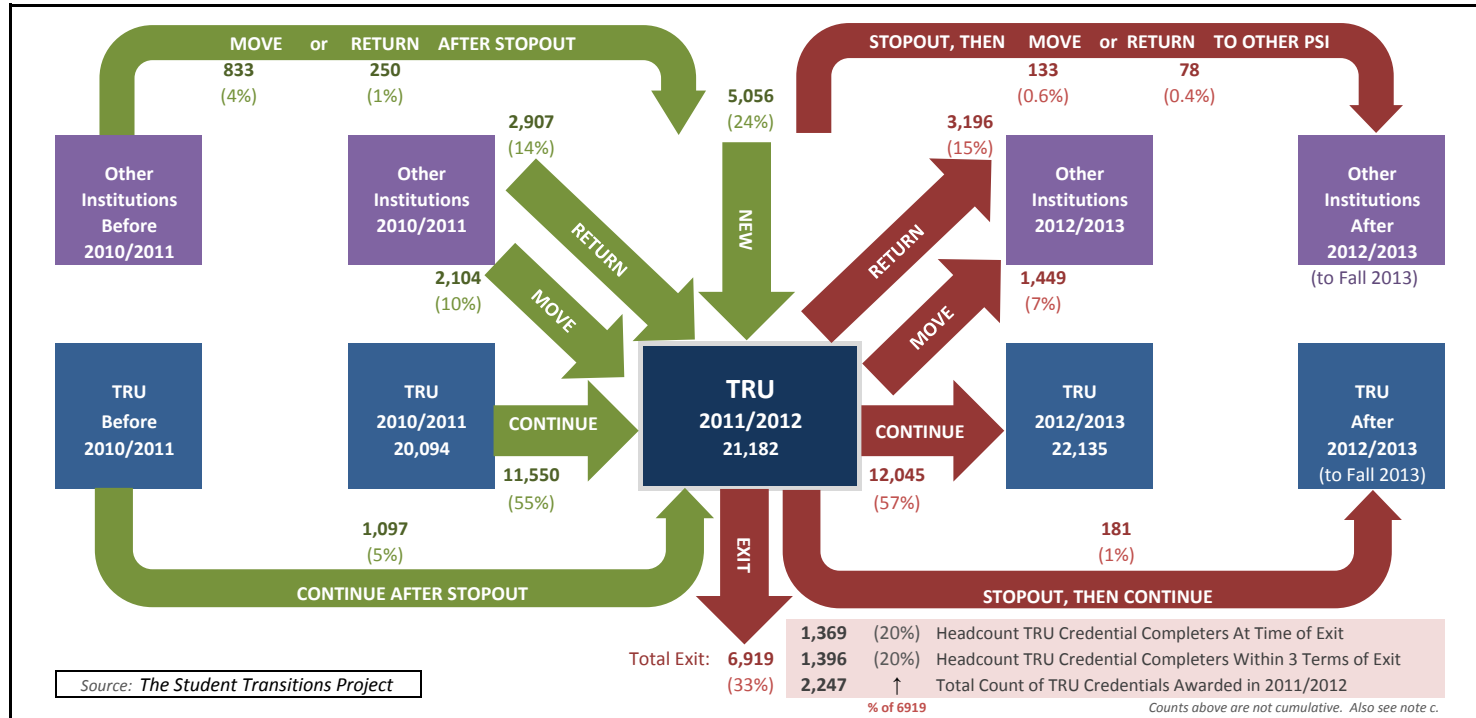

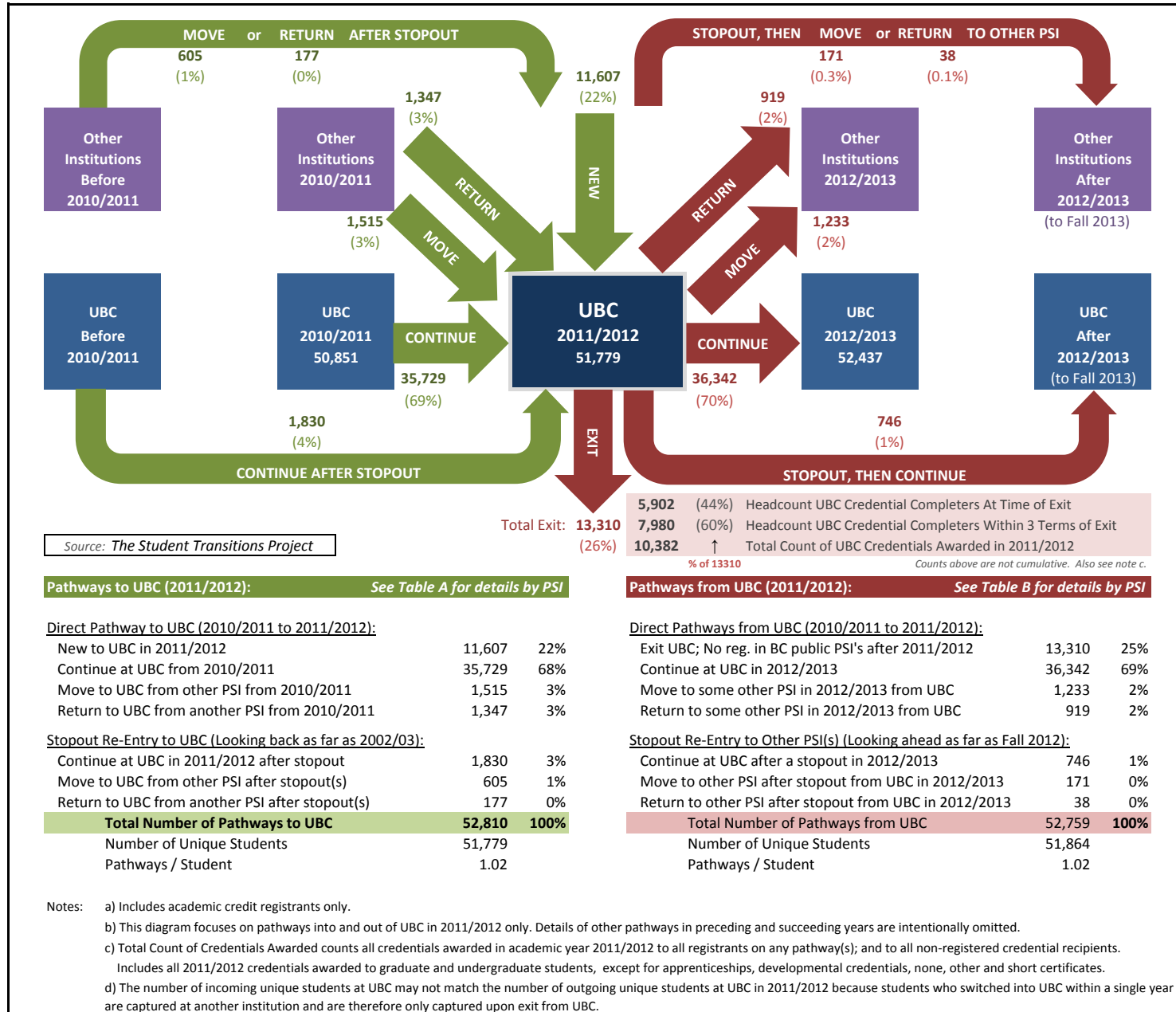

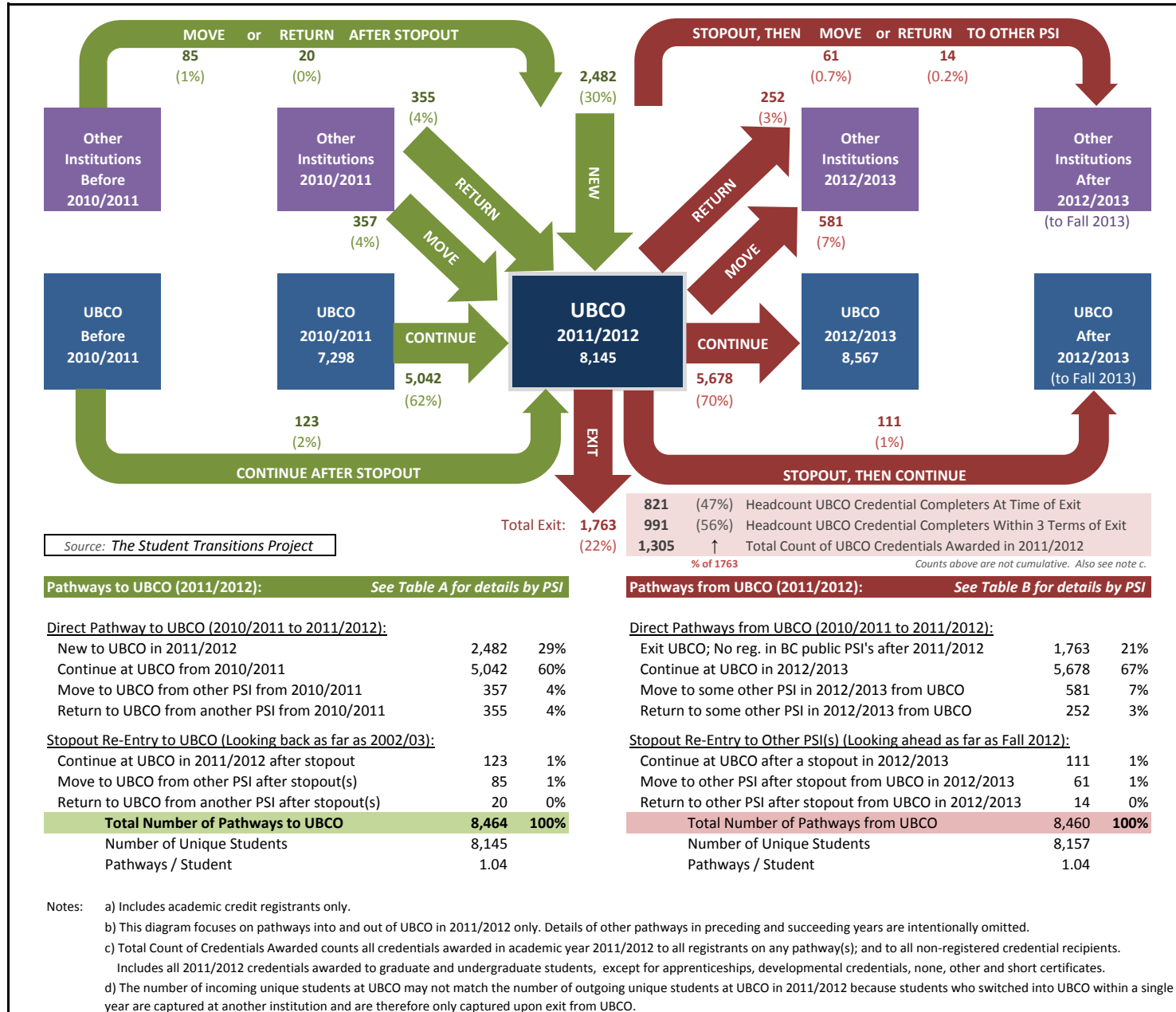

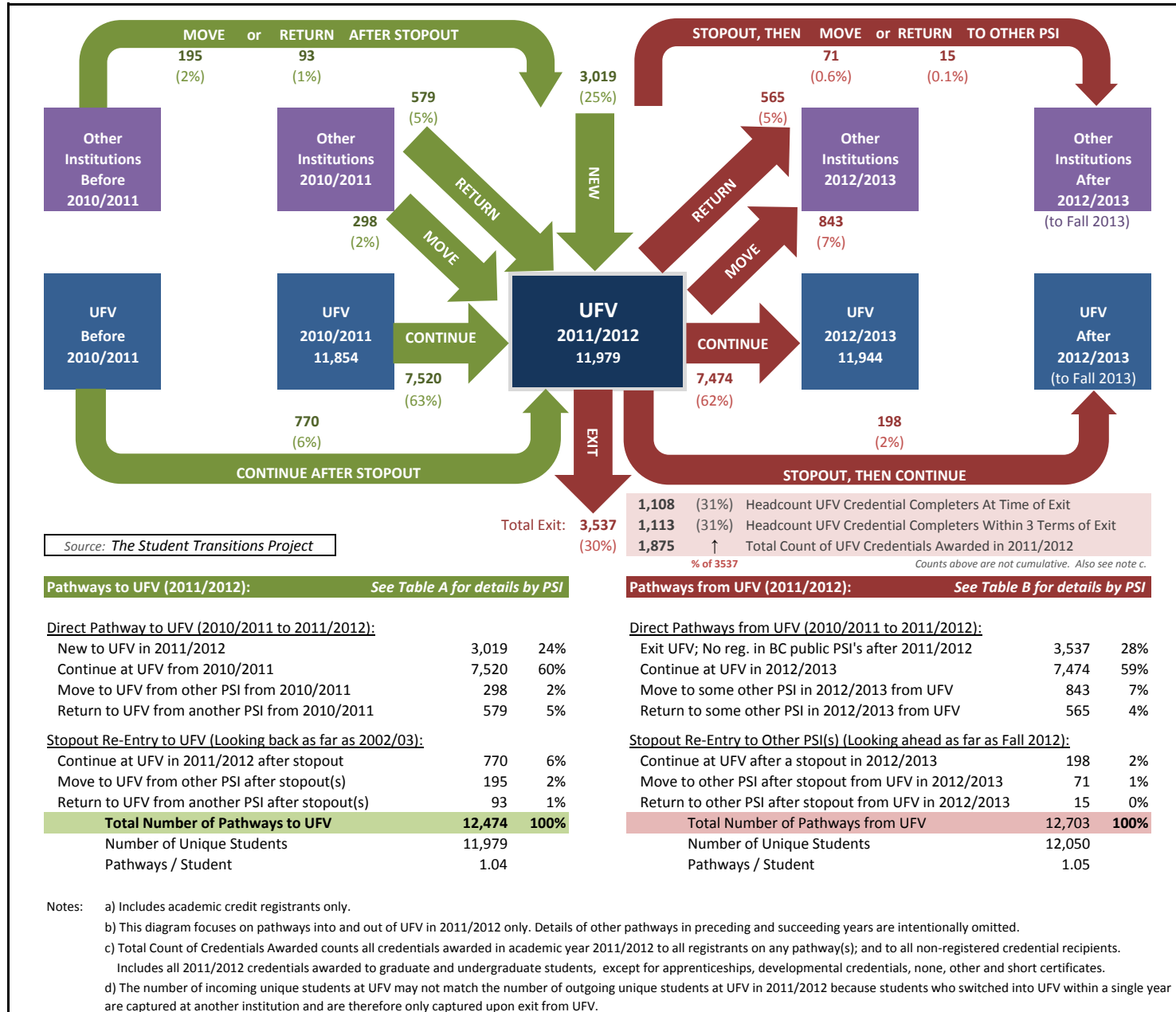
Student Pathways to University of British Columbia, Vancouver (UBC) in 2011/2012 and Future Student Pathways, up to Fall 2013



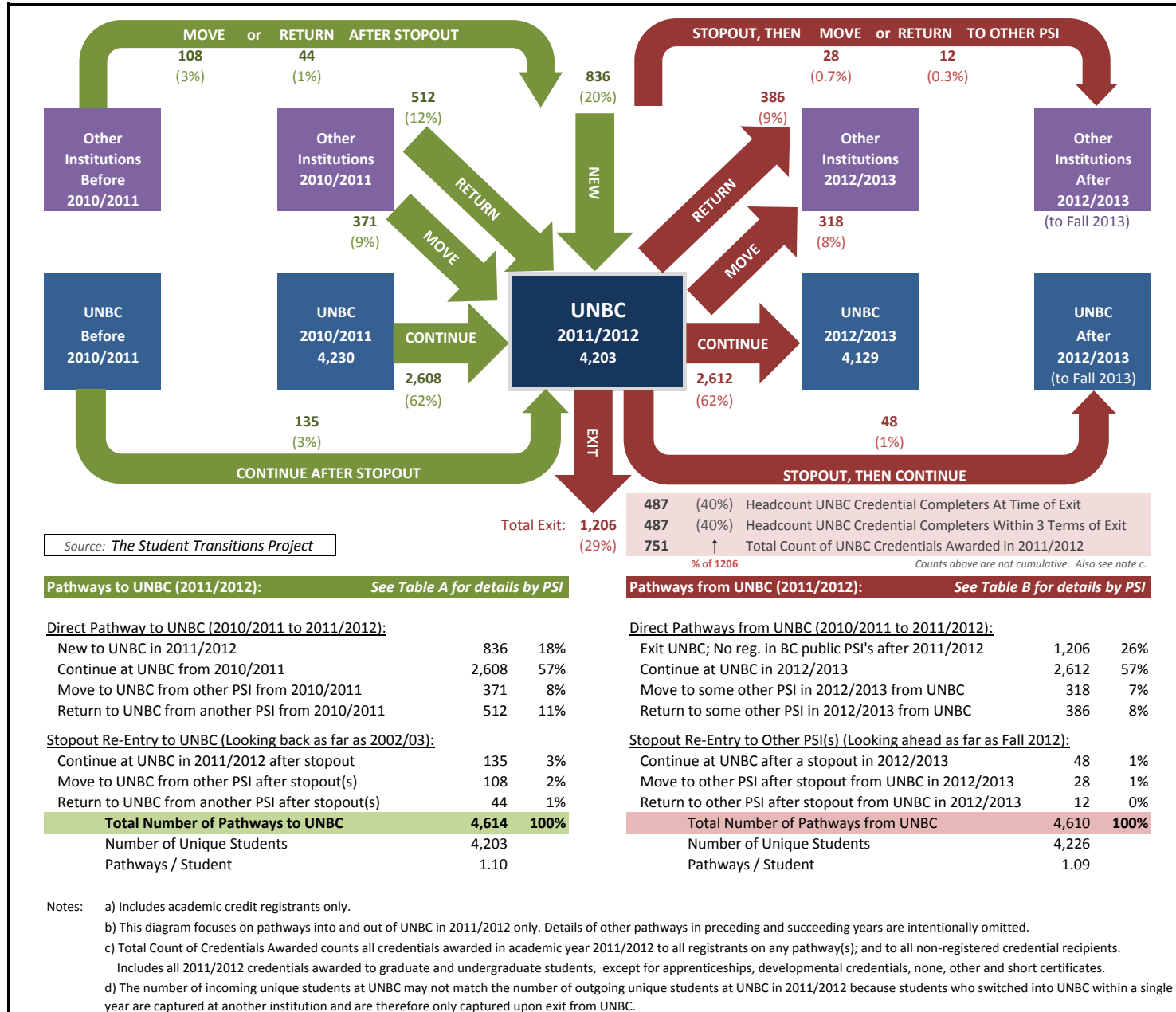
Student Pathways to University of British Columbia, Okanagan (UBCO) in 2011/2012 and Future Student Pathways, up to Fall 2013



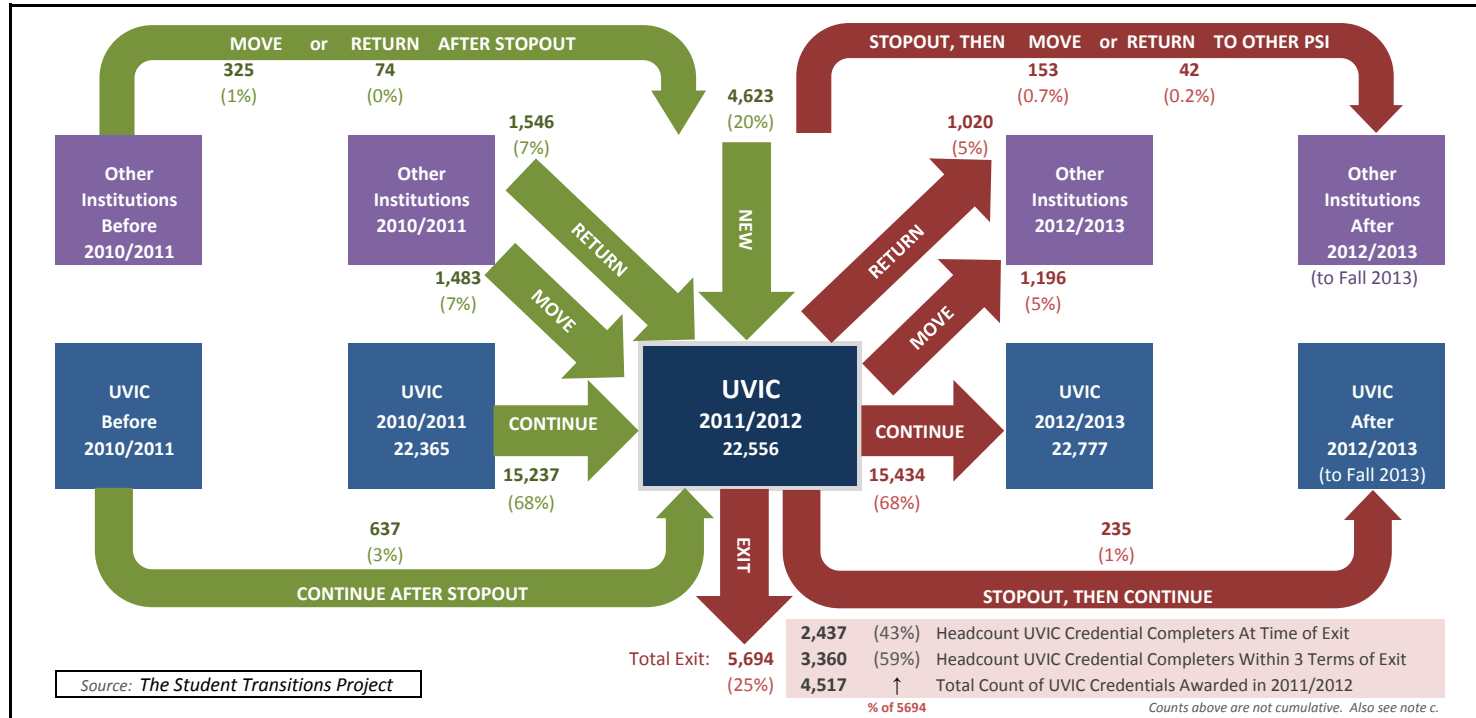
Student Pathways to University of the Fraser Valley (UFV) in 2011/2012 and Future Student Pathways, up to Fall 2013

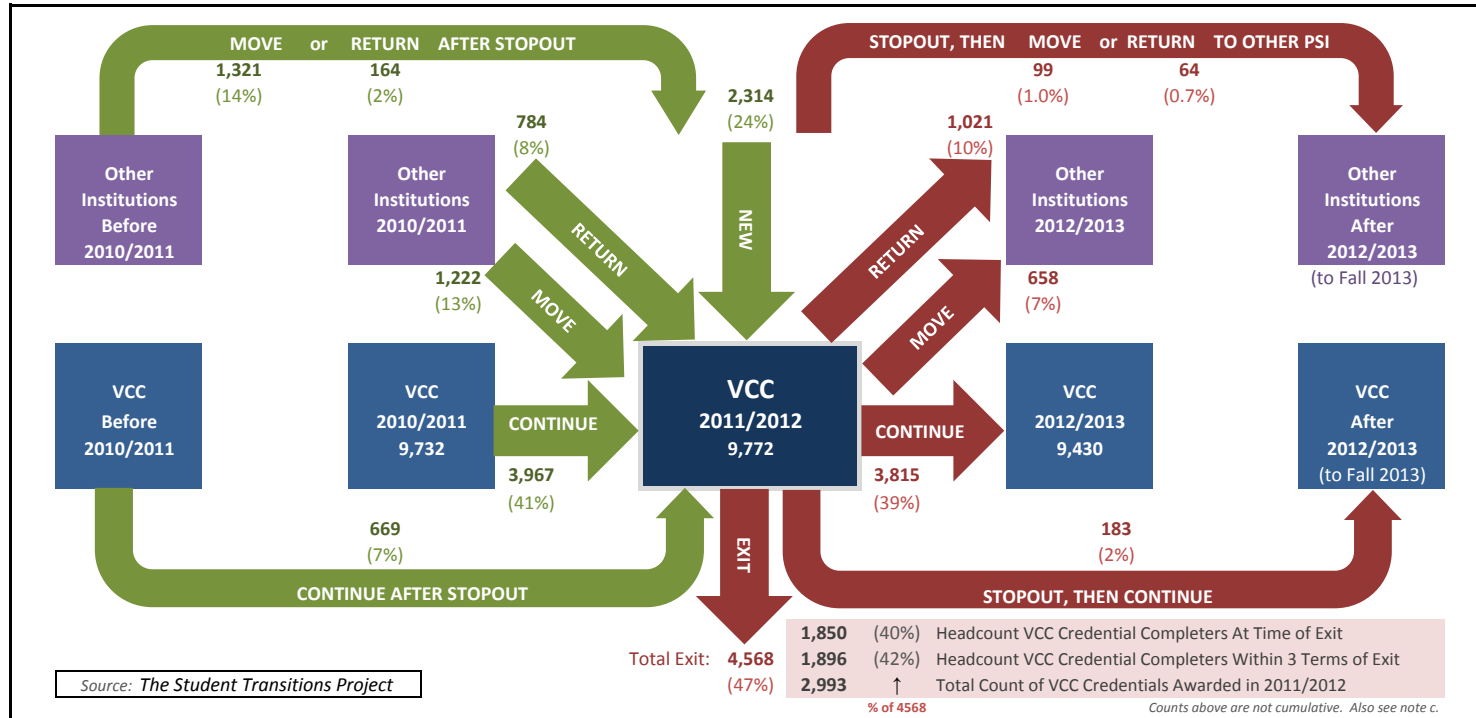

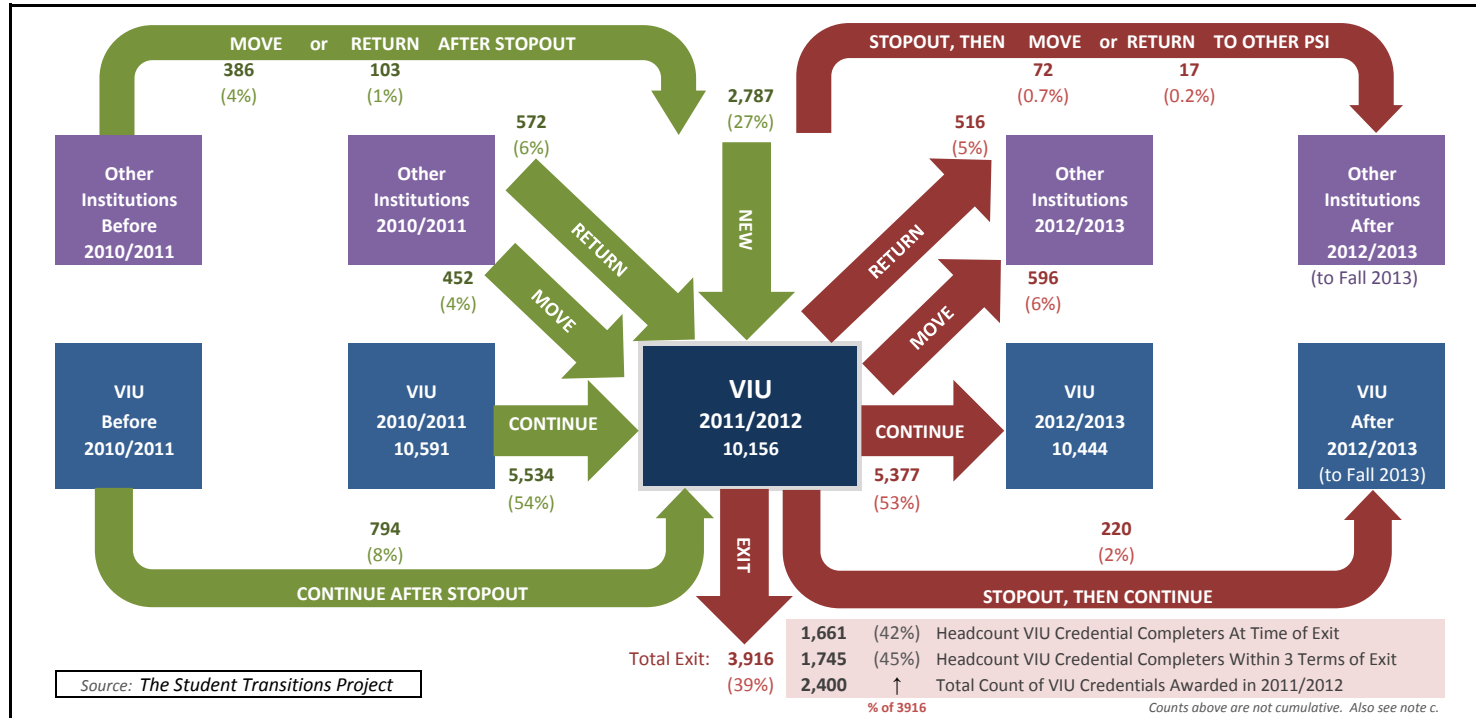
