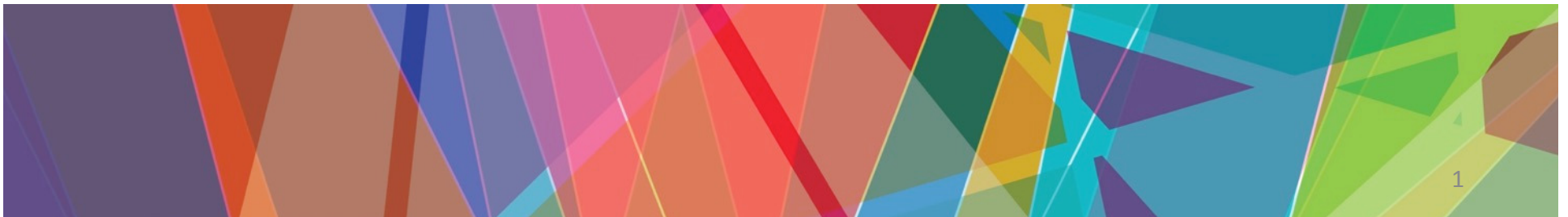

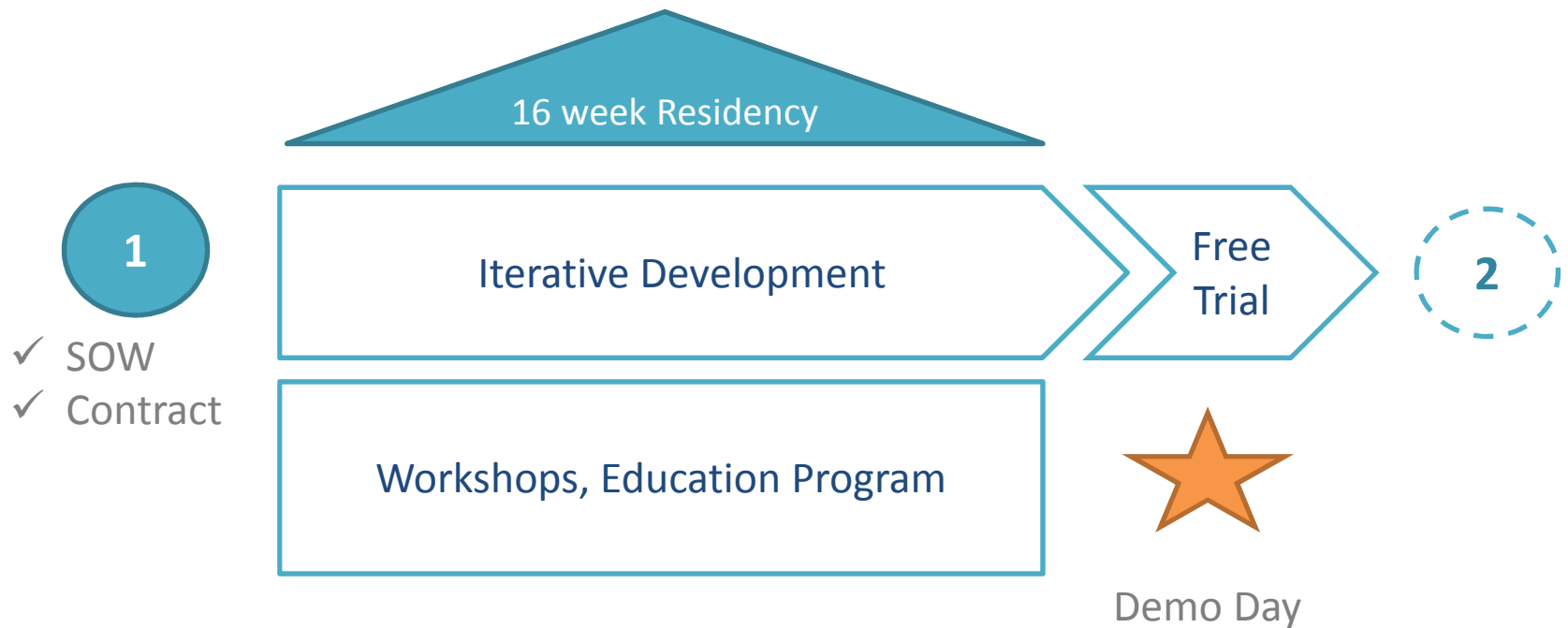

Benefits to participants

At the end of the residency and a free-trial period, companies will have:

- ✓ the full rights to commercialize the solution and sell into the growing gov-tech market;
- ✓ the potential for customer validation and the ability to reference the BC Government as a customer;
- ✓ the opportunity to contract with the Province to continue to support, licence, or maintain the solution they created;
- ✓ a greater understanding of working with and selling to government entities; and
- ✓ access to a network of alumni.



Key Dates

- March 14th - # Calls for Proposal are released on BC Bid
 - April 11: The Calls for Proposal conclude

- April-May: evaluation
 - May-June: Selection of winning proposals, agreement on statement of work and contract signature for phase 1 (residency and free trial period)
-

- June-October: 16 week pro-bono residency.
- November: Demonstration day celebration
- November-March: Free trial period and potential negotiation for a Phase 2 agreement.

Problem Summary: The B.C. Public Service Agency (PSA) is looking to create a consistent, positive and engaging experience for people newly hired to the B.C. Public Service. The Public Service Agency wants to create a dedicated digital service that helps equip new employees with the tools they need, provides orientation information and introduces them to the culture of the B.C. public service.

Problem Summary: GeoBC is looking for a way to automate the Quality Control of large volumes of LIDAR-based geospatial data that helps government establish baselines for resource and ecosystem management, develop models for evidence-based management and more. Ensuring the quality of the data delivered by vendors is currently a manual and time consuming process.

Problem Summary: The Natural Resource Sector ministries are seeking a creative solution to help establish a common understanding of 'Digital Literacy' to ensure we engage all employees to maximise the opportunities presented by technology and innovation,. The new solution would deliver a multi-media platform to create an interactive end-user experience, enabling users to self-select their curriculum and track learning outcomes on a variety of topics such as Agile and UCX.

Program Name: Ministry of Children and Family Development
Problem Summary: The Ministry of Children and Family Development (MCFD) is looking for a way to provide Resource Workers with real-time availability of contracted residential resources, such as beds and associated services, to ensure that when children and youth need to be in the care of the ministry they are matched quickly and efficiently with the most appropriate resource available to meet their needs.
- The solution should allow contracted resources to update and enter the availability of their bed/ service information directly allowing Resource workers to access the information through the app in real time, replacing the current manual tracking

Program Name: Ministry of Education (EDUC)

Problem Summary: The Ministry of Education (EDUC) is looking for a way to provide data securely to school districts across BC as a report or raw data extract, with capacity to both extract and undertake analysis within the tool. Currently EDUC shares a series of PDFs to a limited number of users with varying data proficiency on Sharepoint, which does not provide all users with a platform to interactively work with data.

Problem Summary: DataBC seeks to develop an open source notification service to allow clients to sign up for email alerts via a self-serve tool. This web based tool will allow clients to subscribe to service channels of interest, and receive information related to scheduled changes, status and technical issues.
