Join us for an interactive discussion about the climate impacts of municipal solid waste (MSW) and strategies to reduce methane emissions from regional landfills. This webinar will introduce Local Governments, Economic Development Officers and other interested parties to a wide range of waste specific carbon reduction opportunities in rural British Columbian communities.

Cameron Stonestreet, Business Development Associate and head of the Pacific Carbon Trust's waste initiatives, will lead the discussion and address questions about potential carbon offset generation. Darcy Mooney, the Deputy Manager of Environmental and Engineering Services for the Columbia-Shuswap Regional District (CSR), will speak about the successful Salmon Arm landfill gas utilization project. Dr. Salim Abboud, waste management group leader for Alberta Innovates - Technology Futures, will discuss his research into bio filters and their application on decommissioned landfills in the Thompson River Nicola Valley Region.

Participants in this webinar will learn about:

- Climate impacts associated with waste management in British Columbia;
- Approaches to MSW diversion and landfill methane management that have the potential to generate carbon offsets under the BC Emissions Offset Regulation;
- Landfill gas capture and methane oxidation (bio-filter) technologies currently being employed in British Columbia; and
- Generating new economic opportunities to create jobs and diversify local economies.
