

Recommended Methodology for Describing the Location of Log Parcels in LEXIS

In an effort to provide the most useful information to domestic log users while reviewing advertised parcels, the following examples are provided for the consideration of advertisers when applying for an exemption to export unmanufactured timber.

The use of the approaches demonstrated in these examples will assist in providing the best available information regarding the location of the logs throughout the course of the advertising period in a consistent manner. After the initial application date, and during the advertising period, a parcel may be in transport. Therefore the examples below are designed to show the general origin location, the end destination of the parcel, as well as the towboat companies that may be involved in transporting and caring/controlling the parcels during the advertising period.

Note- Based on a limited capacity on the number of characters allowed in the "Location" field of LEXIS, the examples use a consistent short-hand approach in their description of the location.

Example #1

An advertised parcel of logs is to be moved from Shoal Island near Crofton to the Fraser River where care and control will change to a different towboat company. In this example the boom is being moved from Shoal Island to the Fraser River in the care and control of Gowlland Towing Ltd. and once the parcel arrives at the Fraser River it will be in the care and control of Porter Towing Ltd.

Describe location as follows;

Shoal/Fraser R c/o Gowlland – Fraser R c/o Porter

Example #2

An advertised parcel of logs is to be moved from Nanaimo to the Fraser River with a care and control change at the Fraser River mouth. In this example the boom is being moved from Nanaimo to the Fraser River in the care and control of Jones Marine Group Ltd. and once the parcel arrives at the Fraser River it will be in the care and control of Harken Towing Company Ltd.

Describe location as follows;

Nanaimo/Fraser R c/o Jones – Fraser R c/o Harken

Example #3

An advertised parcel of logs is to be moved from an original location to another location, but remaining in the care and control of the same towboat company.

Describe location using following approach;

Campbell River/Rocky c/o Gowlland

Example #4

An advertised parcel of logs is located at a dryland storage area where no further transport is expected during the advertising period and the care and control is an organization or individual.

Describe location using following approach;
