ORDER OF THE CHIEF GOLD COMMISSIONER

WHEREAS, Egil Livgard, the recorded holder of mineral claim title numbers 1035147 & 1026196 registered technical exploration and development work pursuant to the mineral claims under Section 29 of the *Mineral Tenure Act* (the Act);

AND WHEREAS, Section 33(1) of the Act requires the recorded holder to submit a report in the form and manner prescribed by the regulations respecting this technical exploration and development;

AND WHEREAS notice was given to the recorded holder of the intention to cancel the registration of the recording of exploration and development if a report in the form and manner prescribed by the regulations was not submitted;

AND WHEREAS the recorded holder has not submitted a report in the form and manner as prescribed by the regulations;

I, Mark Messmer, Chief Gold Commissioner for the Province of British Columbia, order the cancellation of the work credits recorded on event 5620100 based on the following:

- Section 16(4) of the Mineral Tenure Act Regulation (the Regulation) states that a technical report must be submitted within 90 days from the date of registration of work in a format acceptable to the Chief Gold Commissioner.
- Section 16(5) of the Regulation states that if the recorded holder fails to submit a report as required, the Chief Gold Commissioner may notify the recorded holder of the intention to cancel the registration of the recording of exploration and development under Section 33 of the Act.

- On September 28, 2016, exploration and development work was registered and recorded as per Mineral Titles Online event number 5620100.
- On January 11, 2017, you were advised by letter that the report for event 5620100 had not been received.
- On April 11, 2017, you were advised by letter of the Chief Gold Commissioner's intention to cancel the registration of the recording of the exploration and development work should the report not be submitted within 14 days of the date of the letter.
- To date, the report has not been received.
