### 1. Policy Rationale & Purpose:

The purpose of this policy is to clarify the requirements for reinstating a licence that has been revoked by the board. An EMA licence is revoked by the board after a minimum one year licence suspension where the EMA has not contacted the branch in an effort to remove the licence suspension.

### 2. Policy Scope

This policy applies to all former EMAs that were previously licensed in the EMR, PCP, ITT, ACP, or CCP categories in BC, whose licence was revoked by the board.

### 3. Policy Statement:

#### **Reinstating a Revoked Licence (out of practice in BC for less than three years)**

If an EMA has not practiced in BC for less than three years, examinations are required to determine that the former EMA is safe to practice in BC. The following is required:

- [apply for the examination process](#)
- successfully complete the written examination for the licence category
- successfully complete the practical examination for the licence category
- successfully complete the jurisprudence examination
- [apply for a licence](#) (Please Note: there are fees associated with licence applications when an exam is required)

#### **Reinstating a Revoked Licence (out of practice in BC for greater than three years)**

If an EMA has not practiced in BC for 3 or more years, training for the category of licence the EMA held and examinations are required to determine that the former EMA is safe to practice in BC. The following is required:

- successfully complete a board recognized training program for the licence category
- [apply for the examination process](#) (all examinations must be completed within 1 year of training program completion)
- successfully complete the written examination for the licence category
- successfully complete the practical examination for the licence category
- successfully complete the jurisprudence examination

- [apply for a licence](#) (Please Note: there are fees associated with licence applications when an exam is required)
