### 1. Policy Rationale & Purpose:

An out of province applicant that is registered or licensed in a profession in a jurisdiction that is equivalent to an EMA in British Columbia is required to successfully complete the jurisprudence examination as part of the application for licensure in British Columbia.

As per the [Examinations – Jurisprudence EMALB2016-04](#) policy, an applicant has three attempts to successfully complete the jurisprudence examination.

This policy outlines the waiting period and requirements for re-applying for a licence when an applicant has not successfully completed the jurisprudence examination after three attempts.

### 2. Policy Scope

This policy applies to all out of province applicants that have not successfully completed the jurisprudence examination after three attempts.

### 3. Policy Statement:

An out of province applicant that was unsuccessful in the application process may reapply for licensure as an EMA in British Columbia 90 days after his/her application file has been closed.

In addition, the out of province applicant will be required to re-submit all of the required application for licence documents as outline on the out of province applicant page of the [EMALB website](#).
