Documentary, 2010 (52 mins)

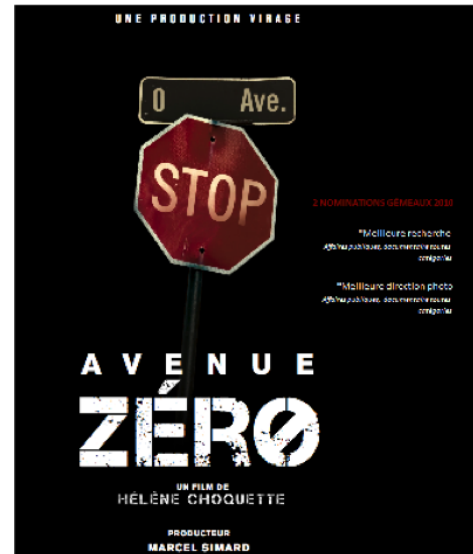

Documentary, 2009 (46 mins)

This documentary focuses on the global issue of sex trafficking of women and children and includes interviews of victims, researchers, law enforcement, and government officials. It is an excellent learning resource for the general public and for professionals working in the field of human trafficking. 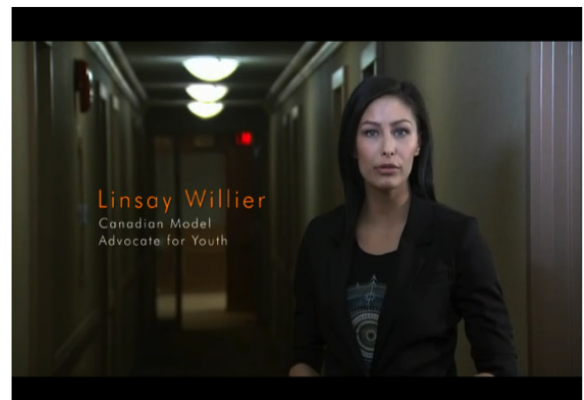


ACT Alberta Public Service Announcement PSA (3 mins)
