WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT Oct 26 – 01 Nov 2015

DANGEROUS GOODS

On 26 Oct 2015, a diesel sheen appeared on the water where the Leviathan II capsized on October 25^h at Plover Point NW side of Blunden Island off the coast of Tofino. The incident was upgraded to Code 2 (urgent status) by the Ministry of Environment Response Officer (MOE RO) due to the potential for heightened media attention.

On 27 Oct 2015, a report of an unknown substance, described as a brown sludge slick, was observed in the Fisherman's Wharf at False Creek in Vancouver. The incident was upgraded to Code 2 (urgent status) by the MOE RO due to the potential for heightened media attention.

On 27 Oct 2015, a diesel sheen appeared on the water when a 46 foot fishing vessel ran aground on October 26th at Steamer Point in Esperanza Inlet off of Tahsis. The incident was upgraded to Code 2 (urgent status) by the MOE RO due to the potential for heightened media attention.

On 27 Oct 2015, a rainbow sheen appeared on the water in Ucluelet Harbour from an unknown source. The incident was upgraded to Code 2 (urgent status) by the MOE RO due to the potential for heightened media attention.

On 27 Oct 2015, a minimal amount of diesel leaked from a 45 foot formula yacht after it struck a rock at Erwin Point near Point Atkinson in West Vancouver. The incident was upgraded to Code 2 (urgent status) by the MOE RO due to the potential for heightened media attention.

On 27 Oct 2015, a member of the public reported fuel globs near Siwash Rock, in Stanley Park, Vancouver. The incident was upgraded to Code 2 (urgent status) by the MOE RO due to the potential for heightened media attention.

On 28 Oct 2015, a light sheen was reported in the Marine between Lions Gate Bridge and Fibreco near Metro Vancouver at the First Narrows. The Incident was upgraded to Code 2 (urgent status) by the MOE RO due to the potential for heightened media attention.

On 30 Oct 2015, Seaspan reported 10-15 gallons of oil off Pemberton Avenue in North Vancouver. The incident was upgraded to Code 2 (urgent status) by the MOE RO due to the potential for heightened media attention.

On 31 Oct 2015, a natural gas leak that appeared to be caused by a vandalized gas metre on 6th Ave in Fernie resulted in an evacuation of 5 apartment buildings in the vicinity. A reception centre was activated by Emergency Social Services for those residents who were displaced. Once the Gas was turned off, the location of the leak was ventilated, and power was restored, the residents were all allowed to return.

BODY RECOVERY

On 26 Oct 2015, Pemberton and Whistler SAR members were tasked by the BC Coroner Service to recover the body of a deceased hiker in the Cerise Creek area near Pemberton.

FLOODING

On 01 Nov 15, Chris Wilson, with the Fraser Valley Regional District Emergency Program, called and reported that in the Chilliwack River Valley there were 10 houses along a stream that had increased in volume and dumped 20-30 cubic yards of silt over several days. There was a concern of potential slope instability upstream. A Geo-Tech was called to provide an assessment of risk factor to ten properties below.

MISCELLANEOUS

On 01 Nov 15, there was a water main break at Westshore Lodge, a seniors lodge. Tasking provided for a warming centre.
