WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT Nov 07 - 13

DANGEROUS GOODS

On 08 Nov, a transport truck and pup trailer went into the ditch at the 49 km mark on the Phillips Connector Road, west of Mackenzie. Approximately 47,000 litres of diesel was on board. The front compartment on the pup was compromised leaking less than 1,000 litres of diesel to the ground. The Ministry of Environment Response Officer (MOE RO) raised the incident to Code 2 (urgent status) and attended the site.

FLOODING

On 08 Nov, the NWE PREOC was assigned fall flooding task # in support of Local Authority EOCs that were activated and engaged in flood response activities in the region.

On 08 Nov, a task number was issued to the Kitimat/Stikine Regional District due to localized flooding in the Dutch Valley and the community of Lakelse Lake.

On 08 Nov, a task number was issued to the Squamish Lillooet Regional District EOC in response to flooding from the Lillooet River in the Upper Pemberton meadows area.

On 09 Nov, a task number was issued to the Village of Pemberton in response to a dike breach behind a 60 unit residential complex known as "The Peaks". Pemberton Valley Diking District was building a temporary berm to contain the water overflow and the EPC ordered pumps to alleviate the threat from rising water.

On 09 Nov, an INAC task number was issued to the SWE Region to track costs associated with flood response activities for impacted First Nations in the region.

On 09 Nov, the Seaton Lakes First Nations suffered flooding in the community which impacted emergency access to the community and forced the evacuation of 10 residents.

On 09 Nov, the SWE PREOC was assigned fall flooding task number in support of EOCs activated by Local Authorities engaged in flood response activities in the region.

On 09 Nov, a task was issued in response to flooding in the Port Alice area which resulted in the closure of Highway 30.

On 09 Nov, the NEA PREOC was assigned a fall flooding task number in support of local authority EOCs that were activated and engaged in flood response activities in the region.

On 09 Nov, a task number was issued to the NEA PREOC as a result of localized flooding impacts to the Wuikinuxv First Nation. A helicopter was used to conduct an assessment of potential landslide impacts in the area.

On 10 Nov, an INAC task number was issued to the NEA PREOC to track costs associated with flood response activities for impacted First Nations in the region.

On 10 Nov, an incident was opened in support of the Lil' Wat First Nation impacted by flooding. Evacuation alerts were issued IR # 1, 2, 3, 6, 8 and 10 in Mount Currie. An Evacuation Order was issued for IR # 1 and 2. The Squamish Lillooet Regional District (SLRD) ESS opened a reception centre to assist with the evacuees.

LANDSLIDE

On 08 Nov, the Emergency Program Coordinator for Port McNeill was issued a task number following activation of their EOC. A geo-technical assessment was arranged following a landslide that impacted 1 house on Beach Drive.

On 08 Nov, a task number was issued for Zeballos following a landslide, 100 feet wide on the Zeballos FSR blocking all road access and isolating 3 to 4 First Nations communities in the area, no homes were impacted. ESS provided food and shelter for individuals stranded on the other side of the landslide, unable to return to Kyoquot.

BODY RECOVERY

On 10 Nov, Chilliwack SAR responded to assist RCMP with a body recovery from the Vedder River.

On 13 Nov, Kaslo SAR responded to assist RCMP with a body recovery from Mirror Lake.
