WEEKLY INCIDENT REPORT 08 – 14 May 2017

BODY RECOVERY

On 14 May 17, Golden SAR were tasked to assist RCMP in a body recovery after a man jumped off a bridge east of Golden on Hwy 1.

On 14 May 17, Arrow Lakes SAR were tasked to assist RCMP in accessing a deceased subject over an embankment in Burton.

DANGEROUS GOODS

On 08 May 17, a truck carrying 20,000 liters of fuel flipped over into a ditch along the 500 Forestry Road, 5 kms south of the Barkerville Highway, east Quesnel. The Ministry of Environment Response Officer (MOE RO) raised the Incident to Code 2 (urgent status) and attended the site. The fuel was successfully offloaded with only a minor amount of non-recoverable fuel leaking to the ditch.

On 09 May 17, there was a potential radiation breach from one of the tunnel at the Hanford Nuclear Facility in Washington State, USA that was escalated from Alert State to Site Area Emergency. The MOE RO upgraded the incident to Code 2 for notification purposes with an immediate downgrade to Code 1. The BC Ministry of Health (lead) remained in continuous contact with Washington State and was advised that the material was contained within the tunnel and it was deemed a “shelter in place” scenario at the local level. BC did not implement the province’s Nuclear Plan. Radiological monitoring continued while the tunnel breach was mitigated, with no indication of a release. The Site Emergency was terminated when the tunnel collapse was stabilized with soil backfill.

On 11 May 17, while loading cargo onto a ship in Vancouver Harbour, a spill of canola oil overflowed a hatch and went to the marine. At the request of the Canadian Coast Guard, the Ministry of Environment Spill Response Officer (MOE RO) raised the incident to a Code 2 (urgent status) with an immediate downgrade to Code 1 after the notifications were made.

EVIDENCE SEARCH

On 11 May 17, Nechako Valley SAR responded to assist the RCMP with an evidence search in the Sturgeon Point Road area of Vanderhoof.

MISCELLANEOUS

On 10 May 17, BCAS requested assistance from Cobble Hill Fire for the medical rescue of a 14 year old youth involved in a serious motorcycle accident.

On 13 May 17, a car drove through a home in Vancouver rendering it unsafe to live in. ESS was arranged for the displaced residents.

FLOODING

On 08 May 17, an incident number was created for flooding on Falkner/ Shuswap avenues in the Village of Lumby, in the North Okanagan Regional District NORD.

On 08 May 17, a flooding incident was created for the Thompson Nicola Regional District TNRD for an evacuation order that was issued in Area M.

On 08 May 17, an incident was assigned to the CSRD for a landslide on the Seymour Main FSR.

On 08 May 17, an INAC task was issued to track costs associated with response activities in support of First Nations impacted by flooding in the SEA Region.

On 08 May 17, a incident was initiated for localized flooding impacting the St. Mary's Reserve graveyard.

On 08 May 17, an incident was initiated for the Splitsin First Nations who were dealing with consequences from flood waters eroding bridge and roadway access on the reserve.

On 08 May 17, sandbags were requested to assist with localized flooding in the Holbrook Road area of Pinantan Lake, TNRD.

On May 08 17, the City of Vernon requested sandbags to control flooding of the BX Creek in Vernon.

On 08 May 17, an incident was initiated for the NORD to provide a Geotech assessment following a landslide that occurred on 05 May on Lakeshore Road in Kelowna.

On 08 May 17, an incident was assigned to the Central Okanagan Regional District CORD for the 5 May, when sand for sandbagging was transported to the Ellison Fire Hall on Old Vernon Road.

08 May 17, an incident was initiated for Kamloops Indian Band in support of flood response activities being carried out on reserve.

On 08 May 17, the Woodscreek FSR was washed out in Ashcroft, displacing one resident in the TNRD.

On 09 May 17, a geotechnical assessment was requested due to a bank failure as a result of localized flooding on the Heffley Louis Creek Road.

On 09 May 17, the Nooaitch First Nation experienced localized flooding on band land near Merritt.

On 09 May 17, localized flooding of the Aeneas Creek in Summerland impacted 3 rural properties.

FLOODING Continued

On 09 May 17, Phillips Lake in the TNRD flooded the Turtle Valley.

On May 09 17, flooding caused a log jam on Whiteman's Creek with potential impacts to the Okanagan Indian Band.

On 10 May 17, flooding on Hartley Creek threatened to undermine Highway 3 near Fernie. MOTI and FLNRO were assessing options to potentially divert the creek onto private land.

On 10 May 17, an incident was opened to provide flood response support and to track repositioning of sand for sandbagging on the Little Shuswap Indian Reserve.

On 11 May 17, the City of Chetwynd opened their EOC for sandbagging and positioning of flood fighting equipment to protect critical infrastructure.

On May 11 17, a new flooding incident was opened to track flood response activities in the Kelowna area of the CORD.

On 11 May 17 the Peace River Regional District PRRD opened their EOC in preparation for localized flooding within the regional district.

On 11 May 17, a seasonal freshet flooding incident and task was assigned to the Northwest Regional PREOC.

On 11 May 17, the City of Oliver requested a task number for sand-bagging in the area of north Oliver and Fairview Bridge.

On 11 May 17, an incident was opened for the TNRD due to flooding on Chase Creek.

On 11 May 17, a log jam on the Okanagan River near Sawmill Road, in Oliver, obstructed the #10 vertical drop flood control structure. Contractors were brought in to remove the logs.

On 12 May 17, an incident opened for Lower Nicola First Nations in support of flooding near Merritt.

On 12 May 17, an incident opened for Westbank First Nations in support of flooding and road erosion.

On 12 May 17, an incident was initiated for the Kootenay Boundary Regional District KBRD due to flooding in the City of Greenwood.

On 12 May 17, an incident was opened to assist the KBRD with flood response activities at Christina Lake, in Electoral Area C.

On 12 May 17, an incident was assigned to the KBRD for flooding in the area of West Boundary, Electoral Area E.

FLOODING Continued

On 12 May 17, a seasonal freshet task number was assigned to the NWE PREOC in support of flood response activities in the region.

On 12 May 17, a task number was issued to the Kitimat Stikine Regional District KSRD EOC in support of flood response activities occurring in the Moricetown area.

On 12 May 17, an INAC task number was issued for the NWE region to track costs associated with flooding of First Nations throughout the region.

On 12 May 17, an incident was opened for the Shackan First Nations, near Merritt, in support of flood response activities.

On 12 May 17, an incident was opened due to flooding that impacted Beaver Road and Highway 16, restricting access for First Nations in Moricetown.

On 12 May 17, an incident was opened to support the Saulneau First Nations due to Pemmican Creek and Moberly Lake flooding that resulted in the evacuation of several residents to Chetwynd.

On 12 May 17, an INAC task number assigned to the NEA Region in support of flood response activities for First Nations in the region.

On 12 May 17, a task number was assigned to the District of Houston in support of flooding on Alix Frontage Road that resulted in lost wells and compromised septic for several homes.

On 14 May 17, an incident was opened for the Salmon Arm District due to road and ditching washout that impacted access for 9 properties, in the Gleneden area.

On 14 May 17, an incident was assigned to Salmon Arm District due to flooding on Gail Creek that resulted in a road washout and potential damage to a gas line.

On 14 May 17, an incident was opened for flooding issues in Salmon Arm. Canoe Creek breached threatening a barn and six properties.

On 14 May 17, an incident was initiated for the Salmon Arm District to divert water flow in order to mitigate major damage to the structure of the Metford Dam.

On 14 May 17, an incident was opened for the Central Okanagan Regional District due to flooding on Shorts Creek that washed out a private access bridge.

LANDSLIDE

On 08 May 17, an incident was created for the CSRD in response to a landslide that occurred on the Seymour Main FSR.

On 08 May 17, the Bulkley Nechako Regional District was provided an incident for their response to a landslide at 2385 Balsam Road.

On 13 May 17, an incident was opened for the Central Okanagan Regional District in response to a Landslide that occurred on Kilkeny Place causing the evacuation of 17 homes.
