CHAP. 16.

An Act respecting a Subsidy for a Railway from Victoria to North Saanich.

[6th April. 1886.]

ER MAJESTY, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Assembly of the Province of British Columbia, enacts as follows :---

1. There shall be paid out of the Consolidated Revenue of the Province Authorizes subsidy to any incorporated Railway Company which shall, within two years for construction of Victoria and Saanich from the passing of this Act, construct, lay out, equip, maintain, and Railway. work a continuous double or single track steel railway of the gauge and standard of the Canadian Pacific Railway, and also a telegraph line with the proper appurtenances, from a point in the City of Victoria to Shoal Harbour at North Saanich, interest for twenty years from the date of the completion of the works, at the rate of two per centum per annum, on such sum not exceeding two hundred and fifty thousand dollars, as may be expended by the Company in the construction of the railway, such interest to be payable half-yearly on the 30th day of June and the 31st day of December in each year after the construction of the railway: Provided always, that such Company be lawfully authorized to construct such railway, and provided further that if there be two such companies, the subsidy aforesaid shall enure to the benefit only of that Company which shall first complete the said railway.

2. The railway shall be maintained and operated for twenty years Company to run so that there shall be run each and every day, and both ways for the entire length of the railway, a train sufficient for the requirements of the public.

3. The schedule of rates to be charged for passengers and freight Rates to be subject shall be subject to the approval of the Lieutenant-Governor in Council. to approval of Lieu-tenant-Governor.
