The Location

<u>Williams Lake</u> is a city in the Central Interior of British Columbia and located in a region known as the Cariboo. It is 552 km north of Vancouver and 240 km south of Prince George and has a population of approximately 11,000 in city limits.

History

The First People in the Williams Lake area were the Shuswap (Secwepemc) Nation, who were part of the Interior Salish peoples. Williams Lake is named in honour of Shuswap Chief William.

Recreational Activities in Williams Lake

Basically, this region has everything you could ever want in outdoor recreation: camping (over 10 provincial parks in the area), mountain biking (3 mountain bike networks in Williams Lake), hiking, canoeing and kayaking (literally thousands of lakes in this region), horseback riding, scenic waterfalls, river rafting, cross-country and downhill skiing, and snowmobiling.

BC Public Service Roles

There are many different career opportunities available in Williams Lake, including: Administrative and Managerial roles, Resource Stewardship Managers, Biologists, Legal and Program Assistants, Agrologists, Forestry positions, Technologists and Land and Resource Specialists, Team Leaders, Probation Officers and many more.
