1.	CLBC replaced printers and photocopiers with multi-functional devices. This resulted in the disposal of 75 printers and 44 photocopiers which were replaced with 58 multi-functional devices.
2.	CLBC amalgamated two offices under the Leading Workplace Strategies model. This allowed us to reduce our footprint by eliminating one location.
3.	CLBC continues to offer a subsidy to employees who take public transit to work instead of using a private vehicle. The number of employees opting for public transit increases slightly each year.

Overview: Community Living BC reduced the number of printers and photocopiers by providing multi-functional devices. The number of machines went from 119 to 58, over 50% reduction. We continue to find ways to reduce our building footprint by amalgamating offices and reviewing the Leading Workplace Strategies model which allows for more mobility.


