

Airports

The **Airport Site Plan** must include:

- 1. Scale e.g. 1:100 1:5,000
- 2. North arrow
- 3. The outer boundary of the proposed application area in relation to other legal boundaries, with lengths/dimensions and a point of commencement identified as latitude/longitude or UTM coordinate
- 4. All proposed and existing <u>improvements</u> (e.g. buildings, structures, roads, powerlines, fences, etc.) where it is clear which are proposed and which are existing. All improvements must be labeled or listed in a legend, must include coordinates and must show lengths/dimensions
- 5. Existing man-made or natural <u>features</u> within and directly surrounding the application area (e.g. waterbody, present natural boundary, height of land, contour lines where possible etc.)
- 6. Source of water and means of sewage disposal
- 7. Proposed access and/ or parking
