KNOTWEED, JAPANESE (Fallopia japonica)







- Rhizomatous, semi-woody, herbaceous perennial
 in the Buckwheat Family that grows to 3 m
 in height; "bamboo-like" stems are green to
 reddish-brown and spotted; leaves are eggshaped, stalked, 10 cm to 15 cm long, flattened
 or rounded at the base with a pointed tip and
 are dark green above and lighter green below;
 greenish to creamy-white flowers are produced
 in clusters from the leaf axils
- An escaped ornamental originating from eastern Asia, Japanese knotweed forms aggressive, dense thickets maintained by extensive and deep, creeping rhizomes. New shoots are known to penetrate thick asphalt
