Unattended Weigh Scales

Standard Procedures for Delivery of Processed Woodchips and Hogged Tree Material

Compliance with the Forest Act and its Regulations

Compliance with Measurement Canada (MC)

- 1. Weighing of trucks must be conducted in accordance with the Weights and Measures Act and its related regulations for Attended and Unattended weighing devices.
- 2. Weigh scales must be re-certified by Measurement Canada to operate from Attended to Unattended.
- 3. The equipment shall be maintained and inspected on a regular basis.
- 4. Sensors and side beams (boards) must be positioned in place immediately at the ends and sides of the scales to ensure the load is fully suspended on the scale platform. A minimum of 4 sensors at each end must be in place for scales less than 27.3 metres (90 feet) in length.
- 5. Traffic light system must be in place.
- 6. Scale must have a weight display that can be viewed from the scale deck.

Load Description Slips

- 7. Load description slips (LDS) will have all information required as per the Timber Marking and Transportation Regulation and may be in electronic form.
- 8. All original LDS will be left on site. LDS will be submitted to the ministry as required in the scale site authorization.

Stratification

- 9. Stratification must be approved by the ministry.
- 10. BCTS and private timber should be stratified separately.
- 11. Renewable tenures held by the scale site operator should be stratified into its own strata.

Breakdown Procedures

- 12. Unattended scales procedures must be displayed in the scale house near the keyboard or another approved location that is visible to truck drivers.
- 13. Breakdown procedures must be in place. A radio or phone must be available with a list of names and phone numbers to call. Trained staff must be available during all hours of operation to deal with issues. In the event of a breakdown or suspension, loads will need to be manually weighed in by a timber weigher.
- 14. All occurrences of scale site break down, which affect the operation of the Unattended scale, must be reported immediately to the local district office.

Data Integrity

- 15. A licensed scaler or other responsible party must review the scale data before submitting to HBS.
- 16. The computer must be in a secured area where it is not accessible by truck drivers.
- 17. There must be no opportunity for truck drivers to edit data after it has been entered and accepted in the computer.

Records of Regular Checks and Issues

- 18. The following information must be recorded in a ledger at the scale site:
 - Maintenance and inspections;
 - Software issues, breakdowns,
 - Incorrect stratification;
 - Functionality of the weight display, sensors, traffic light system, computer, other electronic components;
 - Any change made to a weigh slip must be recorded in the ledger.
 - Other issues.
