

First Peoples' Heritage, Language and Culture Council – 2010 Carbon Neutral Action Report

Executive Summary

The First Peoples' Heritage, Language and Culture Council is a small Crown Corporation with nine FTEs, no vehicle fleet and a single leased office space. Our goal, in step with the B.C. Government's Climate Action Plan, is to work towards carbon neutrality.

Through our *Shareholder's Letter of Expectations*, the First Peoples' Council has agreed to reduce its greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions including accurately defining, measuring, reporting on and verifying the GHG emissions from its operations, implementing measures to reduce those emissions and reporting on these reduction measures and plans.

This year, we began measuring the greenhouse gases we emit through our office energy and paper usage through the SMARTTool system. Each time we order paper, we input the quantity ordered and its recycled content percentage into SMARTTool and, since we share an electricity bill with our office building's owners, we input 25% of the total building energy usage into SMARTTool as that is the proportion of the building we occupy. This arrangement was reviewed and approved by Carbon Action Secretariat staff.

Actions Taken to Reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions in 2010

In 2010, we continued several initiatives that started in 2008, including:

- Purchasing 30% recycled paper
- Encouraging double-sided printing, and turning off computers and monitors overnight
- Housing large, often-referred to documents on the common drive and website
- Sending out pay stubs by email

Plans to Continue Reducing Greenhouse Gas Emissions in 2011

In 2011, we will continue to focus on decreasing paper usage by increasing the amount of 100% recycled paper in all printing jobs internally and externally. On the buildings front, we will also research increasing the use of LED lights.

2010 Greenhouse Gas Emissions

In 2010, the First Peoples' Council was responsible for 0.29 tCO2e in greenhouse gas emissions from our paper use and 3.37 tCO2e from our electricity use at our office.

Offsets Applied to Become Carbon Neutral in 2010

The First Peoples' Council has applied for 3.66 tonnes in offsets from the Pacific Carbon Trust in order to be carbon neutral for 2010.

Emissions Reduction Activities

Actions Taken to Reduce Greenhouse Gas Emissions in 2010:

We enacted several policies to reduce the amount of paper we used because we feel we can have the greatest impact on this greenhouse gas contributor (we have less control in the buildings category, renting 25% of the space in our building).


In 2010, we double-sided everything we printed, edited drafts online and tried to save printing for finalized documents. We also contacted over 10 organizations that send us unrequested, irrelevant faxes to conserve paper usage.

Plans to Continue Reducing Greenhouse Gas Emissions 2011–2013:

The key area we will focus on in the next three years is paper usage. Recycled paper is more expensive than non-recycled paper, but we will examine ways to incorporate recycled paper options that have recycled content that is greater than 30%. We also plan to look into adding more 100% recycled paper into our regular orders.
