recommend that the reservation upon all minerals in the land described in Order-in-Council 414, approved on the 6th day of March, 1950, be cancelled:

(1) of section 16 of the "placer-mining Act", chapter 214 of the Revised Statutes of British Columbia 1948, a reservation be placed upon all minerals in the following described lands in the Omineca and Skeena Mining Divisions, namely:-

All and singular those lands and premises of all that area in the Nechako River, Buchu Lake, Petachuck River, Petachuck Lake, Nutuk Lake, Nataku Lake, Intata Lake, Ootsa River, Ootsa Lake, Sinclair Lake, Whitesail River, Whitesail Lake, Tahsia Skins Lake drainage basins, including all connecting and tributary streams and lakes lying upstream from a line drawn northwest and southeast across the Nechako River one half mile downstream from the outlet of Cutoff Creek and below an elevation of 3,000 feet (assuming mean high-water of Butsuk Lake to be at an elevation of 2817 feet) excepting therewithout that part of the valley of the stream draining Knapp Lake beyond one mile from Cheslatte Lake;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands; namely, all that area in the Nanika River, Kidprice Lake, and Nanika Lake drainage basins, including all connecting and tributary streams and lakes lying upstream from a line drawn east and west across the Nanika River four miles below the outlet of Kidprice Lake and below an elevation of 3200 feet;

And upon all minerals in the following described lands; namely, an area eight miles wide (between Nanika Lake and Tahsia Lake) lying to the northeast of a straight line drawn from the west end of Nanika Lake to the west end of Tahsia Lake;

And upon all minerals in the following described land; namely, an area four miles wide being two miles on either side of a straight line drawn from the head of Tahsia Lake to the junction of Moretzky Creek with the Kenano River; thence three miles wide being one and a half miles on either side of the centre line of the Kenano River to its mouth; thence three miles wide being one and a half miles on either side of a straight line drawn from the said mouth of the Kenano River west for two miles;

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described lands; namely, an area one mile wide along the northerly and eastern shores of Barry Reach, Europa Reach, Allen Reach, Devastation Channel, Douglas Channel and Kitimat Arm to the head of said Kitimat Arm, including one mile southeasterly from Cornwall Point between Barry Reach and Europa Reach;

And upon all minerals in the following westerly from the centre line of the Kenville River from thence an area two miles wide, being one mile on either side of a line drawn from the said point to a fork on Kildala River, approximately twelve miles from its mouth; thence two miles wide, being one mile to the south and one mile to the north of the centre line of the Kildala River for five miles; thence one mile wide being one mile north from the centre line of Kildala River and one-half mile to the northeast end one and a half miles to the southwest of a line drawn from the mouth of the Dale River to the mouth of the Kitimat River;
