Dependency

The term used to describe the relationship between an Asset and a Good or Service. Dependencies can be Critical or Important.



Drinking water has a dependency on pumping stations.

Critical

The term used to describe a dependency when a Good or Service must have a specific Asset and there are no alternatives to the Asset



Fire service has a critical dependency on pumpers and engines. There are no alternatives available.

<u>Important</u>

The term used to describe a dependency when a Good or Service needs a specific Asset, but there are either alternatives available.

Road salting has an important dependency on snowplows, however pickup trucks could also be equipped for the same task.

<u>Assets</u>

Equipment or personnel used to deliver a service.

People, structures, facilities, buildings, materials, and processes can all be considered Assets.



Goods & Services

Resources and services provided to the community by a local authority.

Drinking water, fire & rescue, policing, public monuments, land-use planning, municipal websites and garbage collection are all Goods & Services.
