This report provides an overview of British Columbia's forest product exports and markets. In 2021, forest product exports made up 30% of B.C.'s total commodity export value.



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





Figure 3: Softwood Lumber Export Value \$1.4 \$10 \$9 \$1.2 Monthly Value (lines), \$ billions \$8 \$7 \$6 \$0.8 \$0.6 YTD Value \$3 \$0.4 \$0.2 \$1 Jan Feb Mar Apr May Jun Jul Aug Sep Oct Nov Dec 2021 YTD ■ 2022 YTD 2021 Monthly ••••• 2022 Monthly










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
