Executive summary

Pacific Carbon Trust was established in 2008 to deliver quality made-in-BC greenhouse gas (GHG) offsets to help clients reduce their carbon footprint and to drive the growth of BC's low-carbon economy. Pacific Carbon Trust is responsible for purchasing offsets from BC-based GHG reduction projects that are in compliance with the BC emission offsets regulation, ensuring world-class offsets built on recognized international standards.

This report is an overview and analysis of Pacific Carbon Trust's GHG emissions for 2012. It includes a summary of the actions taken to reduce GHG emissions to date, as well as action(s) planned for the upcoming year. Emissions are reported in a manner consistent with the *Greenhouse Gas Reduction Targets Act* (GGRTA).

Pacific Carbon Trust's emissions from paper and buildings in 2012 were two tonnes of carbon equivalent (tCO₂e). This is consistent with emissions from the previous year, and remains low due to the company's 2010 relocation to a high-performance facility which reduced building energy consumption.

Our emissions reported under the *Greenhouse Gas Reduction Targets Act* were reduced in 2011, and in 2012 our total emissions, which include business travel, decreased from 33 tCO₂e to 26 tCO₂e. This decrease is a result of efforts to reduce travel where possible and use alternative means such as videoconferencing for meetings. PCT Values – As PCT grows, its development will be centred on three core values:

- 1. Entrepreneurial PCT is an innovative company that puts results above process, seizing opportunities and taking the risks necessary to drive the growth of the low-carbon economy.
- 2. Credible PCT is recognized for its expertise, professional standards, and high-quality, credible carbon products.
- 3. Sustainable PCT is a champion for sustainable business practices and a role model for low-carbon operations.

Emission reductions are our core business, which makes reducing and eliminating our carbon footprint a priority in terms of organizational alignment. We have implemented broader sustainability goals across the organization in past years, and as we move forward, we will focus on improving those goals while reducing travel emissions and increasing employee engagement. We also strive to ensure that sustainability is embedded in our business practices throughout the entire value chain.

2012 greenhouse gas emissions

Pacific Carbon Trust's total 2012 emissions were 26 tCO₂e, a decrease of 16% from the previous year. The decrease is due to a drop in travel for the 2012 year, which saw a reduction in emissions of 5 tCO₂e. Emissions from sources covered by the *Greenhouse Gas Reduction Targets Act* were 2 tCO₂e. These operational emissions consisted of 0.5 tonnes from office supplies and 1.8 tonnes from building emissions, which are levels consistent with emissions from 2011. The low levels of emissions associated with operations are due to the high performance levels of the building as well as a disciplined reduction in the use of office paper.

A carbon offset represents a quantified reduction in greenhouse gas emissions, occurring through activities such as improved energy efficiency, which can be used to balance the emissions from another source, such as travel. PCT delivers offsets to many clients, including the BC government and broader public service organizations.

Similar to past years, Pacific Carbon Trust has maintained a lower-than-average organizational carbon footprint, compared to core government (~2.7 tCO₂e/ FTE). In 2012, Pacific Carbon Trust recorded 1.2 tCO₂e per full-time employee, which includes buildings, supplies, and travel. We achieved our performance target of falling below the average carbon footprint for core government, as well as reducing our overall carbon footprint per employee in 2012.

Pacific Carbon Trust continued to voluntarily track emissions from businessrelated travel, which includes staff transportation and hotel accommodation for meetings, conferences, and other business activities that require staff to travel. While GGRTA does not require Crown corporations to report or offset emissions from business-related travel, these emissions represent the largest source of emissions associated with our organization, and Pacific Carbon Trust considers them to be material to our operations. In the spirit of sustainability and accountability, Pacific Carbon Trust has measured, reported, and offset businessrelated travel emissions since 2010 and will continue to do so in the future.



Offsets applied to become carbon neutral in 2012

In order to achieve carbon neutrality for 2012, Pacific Carbon Trust offset a total of 26 tonnes of CO₂e, of which 2 tonnes were required under the *Greenhouse Gas Reduction Targets Act*. The remaining 2012 offsets of 24 tonnes for business travel were offset on a voluntary basis.

Pacific Carbon Trust has been carbon neutral under GGTRA since 2009. We began tracking our footprint in 2009 and voluntarily offset emissions from our buildings and supplies the same year. We began tracking and offsetting our business travel emissions in 2010 and will continue to consider these emissions to be within our reporting and offsetting scope for the future. Pacific Carbon Trust has not changed any aspect of its emission reduction reporting from previous years.

Emission reduction activities

With sustainability and environmental stewardship as driving forces behind Pacific Carbon Trust and its mandate, we pride ourselves on maintaining a minimal footprint in our operations and ensuring that sustainability thrives within the culture of our organization. The following is an overview of actions we've taken to reduce emissions since 2009.

BUILDINGS

In 2010, Pacific Carbon Trust moved to a new office space in a high-performance green building. Although the building has not been LEED certified, it meets the requirements for certification. The facility includes an ASHRAE 90.1 compliant HVAC system with a heat pump, which eliminates the need for natural gas onsite. The facility also features daylight sensors, Energy Star appliances, recycled and reclaimed building materials, indoor bike racks, skylights, and Cradle 2 Cradle¹ certified furniture.



WASTE DIVERSION

Recycling Program: Pacific Carbon Trust has a full recycling program for consumable goods. Currently we recycle electronics at the government asset warehouse. Rechargeable batteries are used when new batteries are needed and any waste batteries are properly recycled.

Composting: Pacific Carbon Trust participates in the Pedal to Petal compost program. Pedal to Petal is a Victoriabased bicycle-powered compostable waste pick-up company.² Through participation in this program we are able to minimize landfill waste and support a local business.

EMPLOYEE ENGAGEMENT

Climate change library: in 2012 Pacific Carbon Trust began building a climate change library to encourage education and knowledge sharing among staff.

Green Team: Pacific Carbon Trust has a staff-led green team that identifies and implements specific actions to further reduce the organization's emissions and encourages staff participation.

Bike to Work Week: employees are encouraged to participate in the BC government's annual "Bike to Work BC" week to encourage healthy living and emission reductions. Total staff kilometres biked is recorded for the week and added to the provincial totals.

TRAVEL

When possible, we try to use alternatives to business travel, although some travel is unavoidable. The majority of our GHG emissions are related to travel, which is why Pacific Carbon Trust has implemented a policy to voluntarily offset business travel. In managing this portion of our footprint, we utilize sustainable methods of travel and encourage our transportation providers to engage in sustainable practices and to offer carbon neutral services.

Staff members are encouraged to carpool and combine meetings for any out-of-town business travel. Pacific Carbon Trust also has a no-fleet policy, and encourages staff to use public transit by making transit tickets available for in-town meetings.



Pacific Carbon Trust staff also use web and teleconference tools on a regular basis to minimize the requirement for travel. Currently, all of our meeting rooms have audio conferencing and two rooms have video conferencing technology.

PAPER and SUPPLIES


Our team continues to use laptop computers, supporting paperless meetings and electronic record management practices. All computers have collaborative software installed, such as OneNote and SharePoint, reducing the need to print documents and supporting virtual meetings. All paper purchases are 100% recycled content.

Future plans to continue reducing

In 2013, Pacific Carbon Trust intends to finalize policies on green savings, green procurement, and limiting business travel to reduce emissions. General actions moving forward include continuing to ensure environmental sustainability is embedded in internal business policies, promoting sustainable practices and technologies internally and throughout the province. Pacific Carbon Trust will continue to build on its existing carbon neutral actions and commitment to carbon neutrality.

In 2012, we were successful in our goal to curb emissions from business travel, and in 2013 we plan to ensure those emissions remain stable or decrease. Additionally, Pacific Carbon Trust shall continue to motivate behavioural changes across the corporation and beyond.


