

Communication Site

Application Requirements Checklist

The following requirements are part of the application and must be provided. Incomplete applications will be returned to the applicant.

In addition to the General Application Requirements included on the Application Form, the following items are required for all Communication Site applications:

- □ See the <u>Natural Resource Online Services website</u> for key requirements and advice on applications.
- You are required to provide at least two (2) <u>digital maps</u> (spatial data, .pdf, .jpg or other commonly used format)
 - General Location Map
 - <u>Site Plan (see link for specific site plan requirements)</u>
- Complete <u>Communications Site Inventory</u> listing all communications uses on the tenure area.
- A completed <u>Communications Site Questionnaire</u>
- A copy of the sub-tenure agreement for each<u>subsidiary</u> or third party using the site. The subtenure agreement should contain the following:
 - Names of the parties involved
 - The proposed term of the sub-tenure. Note: all sub-tenures must expire at least one day prior to the absolute expiry of the head tenure
 - The sub-tenure consideration (fee, rental, etc.) paid to the tenure holder
 - An updated site plan if the additional facilities are not show on the original site plan.
- Copies of Federal government radio licences for all communication uses on the tenure.

AND

- A <u>Management Plan</u> which includes the project overview, project description and additional information as necessary. Information is provided in the <u>Management Plan Application Guidance</u> <u>Document</u>. Specific requirements for Communication Sites are listed below be sure to include these in the relative sections of the Management Plan.
 - 3.1 Construction details, such as foundation type, building(s), power source, tower(s), guy wires, exterior finishing, materials to be used, etc.
 - 4.1 Proposed method of disposal for environmentally hazardous material.

Note: Applicants should restrict management plan content to information that is directly relevant to the proposed project. Management Plans should not contain statements that are biased or judgmental or which may be harmful to other applicants, other licensed users of Crown land and resources, the general public, or businesses operating on private land.
