# Menno Place (Hospital) - 2011 Carbon Neutral Action Report

# **Executive Summary**

The Greenhouse Gas Reduction Target Act, passed in November 2007, tasked British Columbians to take solid action to reduce provincial emissions. As part of the Act, Menno Place has taken steps to reduce emissions, and will continue to work towards being Carbon Neutral.

At Menno Place (Hospital), a large part of our emissions is from natural gas fired boilers and electricity. We continue to take steps to reduce emissions through preventative maintenance and energy efficient equipment replacement.

Menno Place (Hospital) is committed to doing its part in an effort to reduce emissions for future sustainability of the environment, as well as financial sustainability for the organization.

# **2011 Greenhouse Emissions**

Most of Menno Place's (Hospital) emissions in 2011 came from stationary fuel combustion and electricity at 98%. Other sources include paper at 2%.

# **Offsets Applied to Become Carbon Neutral in 2011**

The total emissions offsets that have been applied for in 2011 are 462 tonnes.

#### Plans to Continue Reducing Greenhouse Gas Emissions 2012 – 2013

Future plans to reduce emissions at Menno Place (Hospital) include:

- Increasing staff awareness regarding turning off lights;
- Completing our product incentive program through BC Hydro, which consists of replacing old inefficient lights;
- Investigating building automation to control lights and other pieces of equipment to further decrease hydro usage;
- Replacing old equipment with high efficiency models;
- Integrating products received by Material Management so there are fewer vendor deliveries;
- Working with Fortis BC to find opportunities in equipment replacement to save on natural gas and reduce greenhouse gasses.


