Re: Combined Heat and Power Generation at Greenhouses in the ALR

The Minister of Agriculture has adopted 'Regulating Combined Heat and Power Generation at Greenhouses in the ALR' as a standard to guide local government bylaw development in farming areas (s.916 *Local Government Act*). The Minister's Bylaw Standard has been established by the Minister after consultation with the agricultural industry, local governments, cogeneration industry and the public. Please review your bylaws to determine if they permit Combined Heat and Power Generation (Cogeneration) at Greenhouses in the ALR and consider the new Ministry standard. Please note that combined heat and power generation facilities will continue to require non-farm use applications to the Agricultural Land Commission.
