Re: Conversion of Independent Wine Stores to Licensee Retail Stores

Previous Policy

Independent Wine Store (IWS) licences are wine store licences that are permitted to sell all types of wine (except sacramental wine). IWS licensees may apply to convert their licence to a Licensee Retail Store (LRS) licence. For an IWS to be eligible to convert to a LRS, the proposed location of the converted licence must not be within 1km of another LRS, BC Liquor Store (BCLS) or proposed location of another LRS or BCLS.

New Policy

IWS licensees may now apply to convert their licence to a LRS in their existing location without regard for the 1km separation requirement. The exception to the 1km separation requirement applies only to the existing location of the IWS. If an IWS licensee would like to convert to a LRS in a location other than their current store location, the new location will need to comply with the 1km separation requirement.

Explanation

The 1km separation requirement in the previous policy prevented IWS licensees from converting to an LRS. Removing this requirement is expected to facilitate these conversions.

This regulation change responds to Recommendation #22 of the Business Technical Advisory Panel (BTAP). BTAP is comprised of representatives from various sectors of the liquor industry that was tasked by government to identify their priorities for improving the efficiency and business relations between licensees and government.
