Mountain Pine Beetle Agreement

(the "Agreement")

Between:

Ktunaxa Nation Council

As represented by
Chief Cheryl Casimer, St Mary's Band and Council
Chief Mary Mahscelah, Tobacco Plains Band and Council
Chief Wilfred Teneese, Akisq'nuk First Nation and Council
Chief Christopher Luke, Lower Kootenay Indian Band and Council
Each of which Band is a Party to this Agreement, but which are collectively represented by the
Ktunaxa Nation Council
(the "KNC")

And

Her Majesty the Queen in Right of the Province of British Columbia as represented by the Minister of Forests and Range (the "Government of British Columbia")

(collectively the "Parties")

Whereas:

- The Ktunaxa Nation Council (KNC), being an organization representing the Bands above-written, signed a Forest and Range Opportunity Agreement (FRO) with the Government of British Columbia in June 2006. This Agreement is a short-term additional forestry economic opportunity and does not supersede or alter the FRO.
- An undercut in the Kootenay Lake TSA has resulted in volume being made available to deal with mountain pine beetle infestation and forest health issues in the TSA.
- The Government of British Columbia wishes to support economic opportunities for the KNC.

Purpose

- 1. The purposes of this Agreement are to:
 - a. increase the participation of the KNC in the forest sector; and,
 - b. provide an economic opportunity by inviting the KNC to apply for a non-competitive, non-replaceable forest licence to assist the province in the management of mountain pine beetle in the Kootenay Lake Timber Supply Area, in a manner linked to the KNC FRO and as set out in this Agreement.

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Therefore the Parties agree as follows.

- 2. After execution of this Agreement by the Parties, the Minister of Forests and Range (the "Minister") will invite the KNC to apply for a non-replaceable forest licence (the Licence) under section 47.3 of the *Forest Act* to harvest a total of 100,000 cubic meters of infested and susceptible timber over a five year term within the Kootenay Lake Timber Supply Area. Specific operating areas and species restrictions will be designated within the Licence.
- 3. If the intended holder of the licence is a legal entity other than the KNC, this Agreement must include supporting documentation as specified in Appendix B stating that the intended holder has been validly appointed by the KNC as its representative.
- 4. The invitation will be subject to a condition that prior to making an application for the Licence, KNC will contact the Ministry of Forests and Range and the Parties will work co-operatively to identify an operating area within the traditional territory of the KNC.
- 5. The Licence(s) entered into as a result of the invitation to apply under this Agreement will:
 - a. be for a term of no longer than five years as determined by the Minister;
 - b. contain other terms and conditions required by law, including the condition that the KNC must comply with this Agreement and with the FRO;
 - c. include a term that KNC may not dispose of the Licence except, in accordance with the *Forest Act*; and
 - d. include other terms and conditions as may be required by the Regional Manager, following consultation with KNC and the licence holder.
- 6. An invitation to apply for a non-replaceable forest licence entered into as a result of the invitation to apply under this Agreement may be consolidated with other non-replaceable forest licenses, in accordance with section 19(3)(a) of the *Forest Act*.

Consultation

- 7. The Parties agree to participate in consultation regarding forestry Operational Plans and Administrative Decisions pertaining to increases and/or potential increases in harvest levels to address the mountain pine beetle infestation and forest health issues in the Kootenay Lake TSA, as referred to in section 4 of the KNC FRO.
- 8. During the term of this Agreement, and subject to the Licence being awarded to the intended holder appointed by KNC and the terms and intent of this Agreement being met and adhered to by the Government of British Columbia, the KNC agrees that the Government of British Columbia will have provided an Interim Accommodation, with respect to the economic component of potential infringements of the Ktunaxa

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Nation's Aboriginal Interests resulting from the approval of Operational Plans and other Administrative Decisions pertaining to the harvest of the undercut volumes in the Kootenay Lake TSA. This Agreement is being made available as an interim measure to deal with mountain pine beetle infestations and forest health issues.

Dispute Resolution

If a dispute arises between the Government of British Columbia and KNC regarding
the interpretation of a provision of this Agreement, the Parties will follow the dispute
resolution process set out in the FRO, regardless of whether or not the FRO has been
terminated.

Amendments

- 10. Any alteration or amendment to the terms and conditions of the Agreement must be in writing and duly executed by the Parties.
- 11. Either Party may request the participation of the other Party to review the effectiveness of this Agreement annually and consider amendments to this Agreement.

Term

- 12. This Agreement will take effect on the date on which the last Party has executed it.
- 13. This Agreement will terminate on the occurrence of the earliest of any of the following events:
 - a. five years from the date this Agreement is executed; or
 - b. the mutual agreement of the Parties, or
 - c. upon 90 days written notice by either of the Parties.
- 14. If the FRO is terminated during the term of this Agreement, the Parties shall decide if this Agreement should be amended to include the consultation processes referred to in section 4 of the FRO.
- 15. The Government of British Columbia will not terminate this Agreement on the grounds that the KNC has challenged an Administrative Decision or Operational Decision by way of legal proceedings.

Notice

16. All of the provisions set out in the Notice section of the FRO apply to this Agreement.


17. All of the provisions set out in the Miscellaneous section of the FRO apply to this Agreement.
