## Green Tip: Green up your fall

The lazy days of summer have faded away, but that doesn't mean we can be lazy in our efforts to live "green" and save energy this fall.

Of course hanging your clothes on the line is still the best way to save energy and money, but with days becoming cooler or lack of room indoors this may not always be an option.

No electric dryer is perfectly energy efficient so here are a few suggestions to help you save all around.

Tip:

1. Use wool dryer balls – These awesome little balls can help you reduce drying time (depending on your dryer) by 30 to 50 per cent. They work by lifting and separating your clothes while tumbling and they help keep laundry crease free. You can purchase them in stores, or make your own.
2. Make a day of it - dry multiple loads back to back to make the most of your dryer's heat.
3. Sort it out – sort your clothes before tossing them in the dryer. Dry items together that have the same weight or fabric types.
4. Here's a hint – unclog the lint – with every load clear away the lint trap so it doesn't reduce air flow and hamper (no pun intended) performance.
