

This report provides an overview of British Columbia's forest product exports and markets. In 2022, forest product exports made up 24% of B.C.'s total commodity export value.

Starting with this March report, Macau is included in the exports to China. The historical export data from 2013 to 2022 has also been updated.





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





Figure 3: Softwood Lumber Export Value \$1.0 \$8 \$0.9 \$7 Monthly Value (lines), \$ billions \$0.8 \$6 \$0.7 \$ bill \$0.6 \$0.5 \$0.4 \$0.3 \$2 \$0.2 \$1 \$0.1 \$0.0 Jan Feb Mar Apr May Jun Jul Aug Sep Oct Nov Dec ■ 2022 YTD ■ 2023 YTD 2022 Monthly ••••• 2023 Monthly







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




Figure 9: Logs Export Value \$0.07 \$0.6 \$0.06 Monthly Value (lines), \$ billions \$0.5 \$ billions \$0.05 \$0.4 \$0.04 \$0.3 \$0.03 \$0.02 \$0.1 \$0.01 \$0.00 \$0.0 Jan Feb Mar Apr May Jun Jul Aug Sep 2022 YTD ■ 2023 YTD -- - 2022 Monthly ••••• 2023 Monthly
