2.04.3 POLICY STATEMENT

- (1) Individuals who own and operate private aircraft may be enrolled as volunteers in the PEP Air Service (PEP Air) to perform search and rescue activities on behalf of EMBC or the Canadian Armed Forces. Volunteers are also engaged to act as navigators and spotters, flying with either the Canadian Armed Forces or PEP Air on air SAR tasks.

2.04.4 CONDITIONS/RESPONSIBILITIES

- (1) All volunteers must register with PEP Air, which is an associate of the Civil Air Search And Rescue Association (CASARA).
- (2) This policy is conducted in accordance with the most current approved version of the PEP Air Policy Manual.
