1	Manning Provincial Park, Eastgate / Bonnevier Prescribed Fire and Fuel Management Preparation	Manning Provincial Park is a large park straddling the crest of the Cascade Mountains. FEP funded BC Parks to retain a crew to conduct preparatory works in an area adjacent to Highway 3. Work included hand limbing, brushing and raking over approximately 20 hectares. 2	Wells Gray Provincial Park Roads Maintenance	Complete essential road maintenance and upgrades for safe public access and increased road lifespan. Includes water maintenance (culvert armouring, maintenance, swale improvement), ditching, gravel fill if needed, grading, and brushing on the entire Battle Mountain Road, Stillwater, and Clearwater River Road.	Clearwater, Barriere and Vavenby
3	Community Access Road Maintenance	Road Maintenance on the Finlay Forest Service Road (FSR) 154.5 total kms and Finlay- Manson FSR 31.5 total Kms. Works included summer road grading and winter snow removal to improve access to communities.	Mackenzie, Germansen Landing, Manson Creek, Tsay Key, Kwadacha
4	Bridge Maintenance and Repair	Bridge maintenance and repair work identified and reported by professional engineers on structures throughout the Okanagan Shuswap Natural Resource District	Communities from Salmon Arm to Keremeos
5	Graystoke Forest Service Road	Repair slide damage at 53.5 km of Graystoke FSR in Mission Creek Community Watershed (Kelowna).	Kelowna
6	Enhancements and Repairs to Various Recreation Sites and Trails in the 100 Mile House Natural Resource District	To have crews and equipment work closely with ministry staff in completing numerous small projects on various sites and trails. Projects varied in size and scope from cleaning ditches, culvert installation, water management, trail construction, campground expansion and improvements.	100 Mile House, Clinton, 70 Mile House and Lac La Hache

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7	Grade, shape and crown - Bear Creek FSR, Bear-Jackpine FSR, Gillard FSR, Peachland Main and Peachland - Trout FSR	Maintaining (grading) high value recreation roads in the Kelowna, West Kelowna, and Glenrosa area. This work will help diversify the local economy and enhance tourism values in the area, while maintaining critical road infrastructure.	Kelowna and Glenrosa
8	Removal of log debris dam around an FSR bridge.	Use both manual labour and machinery to pull logs away from the bridge abutments, in order to clear the river of jammed up logs, which hinders fish passage and river boat traffic.	Takla which is 200 km northeast of Fort St James
9	Marble River Provincial Park Storm Damage Assessment and Trail Remediation	Work included danger tree assessments, re-establishment of the pedestrian trail, and clearing catastrophic blowdown/windfall on approximately 1.5kms of the trail.	Port Alice, Port Hardy and Port McNeill
10	Criss Creek FSR K177 Bridge Replacement	This will support a bridge installation near Skeetchestn reserve. The bridge structure was washed out in the freshet of 2020 and must be replaced to ensure access along Criss Creek FSR. Work includes the supply, delivery, and placement of rip rap for a new bridge installation on Criss Creek FSR.	Skeetchestn Band
11	KVR Trail Trestle (KV-039) Trout Creek Bridge Repairs	Priority repairs to the Kettle Valley Rail (KVR) Trail Trestle (KV-039) and Trout Creek Bridge.	Summerland, Penticton, Peachland and Kelowna.
12	Fence Revitalization Coutlee Plateau	Works included clearing fence lines, cutting off fallen logs, removing danger trees threatening public safety, clearing old unusable fencing materials, restringing wire and installing new posts.	Coutlee Plateau South of Merritt
13	Mount Cain Ski Area Brushing and Gladding	A work crew was hired to 1) Brush the ski runs on the lower mountain to assist the ski hill to operate in low snow conditions, and 2) fall danger trees that threaten existing infrastructure, and 3) fall understorey vegetation and brush (leaving large diameter trees) in the glades in between the ski runs on the lower mountain to improve tree skiing in low snow conditions on the lower mountain. 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14	Recreation Site Access Road Reconstruction	Road reconstruction of Crown land access roads into seven high value, high use recreation sites in the Campbell Lake area. Work focused on environmental and safety upgrades.	Campbell River
15	Rennell Sound Landslide Removal and Clean Up of seven slides	In Fall of 2020 seven landslides occurred on the Rennell Forest Service Road, blocking the road to all users. The slides impacted 100 m of road, plugging drainage structures and burying the road in mud, rock and timber. FEP funding was employed, using excavators, rock trucks and other equipment to restore access to this high value recreation area.	Haida Gwaii
16	Road access improvements of Marion Creek FSR#9229	Marion Creek FSR has significant recreational use for hiking and access to an Alpine Club of Canada alpine hut (Hišimýawił) that is available for public use as rental accommodation. There is currently no industrial use and the road is only maintained at a "Wilderness" level, requiring 4x4 access. FEP funding improves access on this road for recreational use.
