

2015 Carbon Neutral Action Report School District No. 74 (Gold Trail)


Declaration Statement:

By June 30th 2016, School District #74's final Carbon Neutral Action Report will be posted to our website at www.sd74.bc.ca.


Overview:

School District No. 74 (Gold Trail) is consistently reaching for emission reductions through efficiencies within the organization. The district shows an overall reduction of 32% of tCO2 emissions for the period 2011 to 2015. While it does not show an overall increased savings, it is encouraging to see the improvement is in building operations.

In all fuel types consumed, the district shows a consistent reduction in consumption. Some of the reduction has been through consolidation of schools to increase efficient use of the facility, while other reductions are due to upgrades in technology.



Looking forward and based on the past five (5) years, it is anticipated the school district will encounter continued success in emission reductions.


