On May 28, 2021, the Emergency Medical Assistants Licensing Board (the “Board”) held a hearing to determine the issues raised by the charges, namely whether the Respondent breached a term or condition of his licence by communicating with the Board’s continuing competence program administrator and the Board’s discipline counsel in an unprofessional manner. Pursuant to Rule 17.4 of the Rules for Complaints, Investigations and Disciplinary Hearings (the “Rules”), the Director must post a summary of the order referred to in Rule 17.2 on the Board website.

The EMA did not attend the hearing, and nobody appeared on their behalf. Upon hearing evidence and the submissions of Discipline Counsel, the Board pursuant to s.7 of the *Emergency Health Services Act*, was satisfied on a balance of probabilities that the Respondent breached a term or condition of their licence.

As such, on November 24, 2021, the Board imposed the following conditions on the Respondent’s licence:

- a. The Respondent must successfully complete a Board-approved course at their own cost on “professionalism in paramedicine” before January 31, 2022. The Board must approve the course prior to registration.
- b. The Respondent must complete a consultation session regarding professionalism in paramedicine with a branch-appointed clinical consultant to the satisfaction of the Board before January 31, 2022.
- c. The Respondent’s EMA licence will be suspended for sixty (60) days commencing February 1, 2022; however, the suspension will be stayed if the Respondent complies with the conditions set out at paragraphs (a) and (b) above.

The Respondent failed to comply with the conditions by January 31, 2022, as required. As such, the Respondent’s EMA licence is suspended for a period of sixty (60) days commencing February 1, 2022.
