Requirement Description:	2: Immediately upon approval of the terms of reference and work plan by the Director, cause a Qualified Professional to implement the comprehensive monitoring program and complete the comprehensive EIA according to the work plan and terms approved by the Director, but subject to any further directions or amendments to the work plan or terms of reference made by the Director.	
Details/Findings:	On December 6, 2016 Joe Klassen advised the Director that he had directed the qualified professional to cease working on the monitoring program and EIA. As a result, the qualified professional could no longer complete the EIS Report per the terms of the November 28th letter. A stay was not requested of the EAB. The QP was directed to stop work which is contrary to "cause a QP to implement and complete the monitoring program and EIA." On December 23, 2016, the EIA was submitted. However, the submission was not provided on time and therefore the Order recipient was found out of compliance.

Requirement Description:	3: Submit the Environmental Impact Assessment together with the results of the comprehensive monitoring program to the Director by August 1, 2016.	
Details/Findings:	In a letter dated July 29, 2016, the date for the submission of the EIA with the results of the comprehensive monitoring program was amended to October 14, 2016. In a letter dated November 28, 2016, the date for the submission of the EIA and comprehensive monitoring plan was amended to December 12, 2016. On December 23, 2016 via email, Associated Environmental submitted a document to cover the requirements of the EIA (referred to as an EIS). As the required submission date for this document was December 12, 2016, after numerous amendments to the submission date (August 1, October 14, December 12), the regulated party has been found out of

Details/Findings:	4: Must retain a suitably Qualified Professional to prepare an Action Plan detailing measures to be taken to prevent the environmental impacts identified in the EIA and submit the Action Plan to the Director by August 15, 2016. The Action Plan must include, but is not limited to: i) description of proposed manure storage measures that ensure sufficient storage, ensure proper construction of permanent and temporary storage facilities with appropriate setbacks, and ensure minimal impact to the environment; ii) description of proposed drainage management measures to effectively control runoff to ensure that solids, leachate, contaminated runoff and drift from sprayed materials do not enter watercourses, penetrate to groundwater or leave the property; iii) determination of Agronomically correct rates of application of agricultural waste during agricultural operations on the Lands, and a plan for ensuring application of agricultural wastes does not exceed Agronomically correct rates; iv) description of proposed remedial measures to ensure manure applications do not extend beyond property boundary, in a watercourse, and near industrial and drinking water wells; v) description of a proposed ongoing soil, surface and groundwater monitoring program for nitrate and E.coli for the purposes of monitoring the effects of Action Plan; vi) a map identifying all fields (owned, leased, licensed or otherwise part of the Lands) utilized for farm operations, identifying the locations of manure storage facilities, feeding areas, drinking water well(s), industrial well(s), surface water intakes, and any other notable work(s) and vii) a timeline for implementation of the Action Plan. If the Action Plan proposes that manure will be transferred to Purple Springs Nursery Inc. as an alternative or in addition to other manure storage measures to be undertaken by the Addressees, the Action Plan must be accompanied by a written agreement with Purple Springs Nursery Inc. that specifies the amounts and timing of manure that Purple Springs Nur

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Overview

On June 8, 2016, Pollution Prevention Order #108432 (Order) was issued to Kenneth Regehr, operator of a cattle feedlot located near 4516 Hullcar Road in Armstrong (Lands), as a result of the introduction into the environment of agricultural waste, including manure and/or manure laden effluent. The presence of nitrate is causing the groundwater in the unconfined aquifer that lies in part underneath the Lands (commonly referred to as the Hullcar Aquifer 103) to be unfit for potable purposes for some residents in the Hullcar Valley.

On July 29, 2016, an amendment letter to the Order was issued. The amendment included an additional point to be covered under requirement 1, changed the due date for requirement 1 from August 1 to September 30, 2016, changed the due date for requirement 3 from August 1 to October 14, 2016, changed the due date for requirement 4 from August 15 to October 31, 2016, changed the date for requirement 6 from November 30, 2016 to June 30, 2017 and changes to the due dates for requirement 7 from August 15, 2016, November 30, 2016 and November 30 of each year to October 31, 2016, June 30, 2017 and June 30 of each year respectively.

On November 28, 2016 a letter between Christa Zacharias-Homer and Kenneth Regehr confirmed further amended dates for the following items;

Requirement 3: Submit the Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) together with the results of the comprehensive monitoring program to the Director – the EIA and the comprehensive monitoring program are received by the Director's office by December 12, 2016.

Requirement 4: "Retain a Qualified Professional to prepare an Action Plan detailing measures to be taken to abate the environmental impacts identified in the EIA and submit the Action Plan to the Director" – the Action Plan is received by the Director's office by January 6, 2017.

Requirement 7: "Must publically post the Action Plan required by this order" – the Action Plan must be posted publically by January 6, 2017."

A desktop inspection of the order requirements was conducted for the period between October 4 2016 to February 6, 2017. Kenneth Regehr was found to be out of compliance with requirements 1,2,3,4 and 7 of Pollution Prevention Order #108432.
