## **Types of ECE Certificates in BC**



- Certification is based on legislative requirements & the BC Child Care Sector
   Occupational Competencies
- Majority of BC's Licensed Child Care Facilities must employ certified ECEs and Assistants



## **ECE - One Year Certificate Requirements**

#### **Character & Skill Requirements (CCLR 19)**

All Applicants must demonstrate:

- Good Character
- Personality, ability & temperament necessary to manage or work with children
- Training, experience & skills necessary to carry out assigned duties

#### ECE – One Year (CCLR 31)

Academic Requirements:

- BC recognized ECE program; OR
- Equivalent Program

Applicants who are minors require parent/guardian consent to apply.



## **Equivalent Program Requirements**

To be considered equivalent education must:

- Be completed at an institution approved by a provincial, state, national, or other government body
- Include content and hours that are comparable to a <u>recognized</u> ECE program in B.C.:
  - Covering topics that relate to the education and care of children birth to 5 years old (comparable to the BC Child Care Sector Occupational Competencies)
  - Including practicum/placement hours that provide opportunity for the student to practice what they learned in the classroom with children birth to 5 years old
- To determine if an applicant's education is equivalent to BC standards, the ECE Registry requires information about the specific program (education) completed by the applicant




### **International Applications Requirements**

- Early Childhood Educator Certification Application Equivalency
- Character Reference
- Detailed Course Outlines or Syllabi
- Program Confirmation Form
- Official Transcript
- International Credential Evaluation Service Comprehensive Report (BCIT)
  - Fee waivers are available to eligible applicants to cover the cost of one credential evaluation (depending on funding availability)
- Copies of two pieces of government issued ID

Documents written in a language other than English must be professionally translated at the applicant's own expense.
