

2023 Drought Resources for B.C. Livestock Producers

Prolonged periods of dry weather can cause forage damage and impact livestock water supplies. Below are some out-of-province resources that may assist livestock producers to plan and respond to drought.

As a livestock producer being affected by drought, focus on these 6 topics to start:

 - What are cyanobacteria (blue-green algae)? Province of British Columbia (gov.bc.ca): cyanobacteria (also known as blue-green algae) are naturally occurring bacteria that are common to freshwater ecosystems across B.C.
 When creating a bloom, there are several species capable of producing toxins that can be harmful to humans, domestic animals and livestock. In B.C., your local Health Authority will post advisories for blue-green algae (cyanobacteria) in water bodies used for drinking or for recreation.
