"That part of the surface of Lot 1495, Rupert District, being the "Happy Jack" mineral claim within Lot 553, Rupert District, T.L. 4388P, containing 5.95 acres, more or less."

and the said lands so withdrawn are and shall be henceforth no longer subject to or form any part of the said Tree Farm Licence Number 39.
