### Action

- 1. Most of the resources provided to Provincial Sport Organization volunteers are provided in an electronic format. BC Games Society also provides the majority of supporting information for the Host Community volunteers in electronic format. Volunteers are also encouraged to use cloud system to share documents electronically. Moreover, approximately 90% of the results are submitted electronically.
- 2. BC Games participants are accommodated in their sport venue or as close as possible to reduce the transportation needs during the Games. Bio-diesel buses are used for transportation of BC Games participants to and from the Host Community. BC Games Society also has a no-idling protocol for all buses and cars used in the Games.
- 3. The BC Games Society encourages the Host Communities to have an environmental plan. Information given to the volunteers, participants, and the community includes statements that the BC Games Society is committed to sustainability and reducing the impact on the environment. All participants are encouraged to travel lightly, buy local, ethical and green, and minimize waste. There is no individual bottled water in any of the sport venues or at the special events. Breakfasts and dinners for participants are provided buffet style, and lunches are delivered in bulk, reducing packaging and allowing for items to be returned and reused.


Describe Plans your organization has for continuing to minimize your GHG emissions

BC Games Society will continue to try to decrease the green house gas emissions in the office in Victoria, as well as in each host community. The Society will continue to lead the host communities around the province to host sustainable multi-sport events. BC Games will continue using its one of a kind LED torch that eliminates 900,000 cubic feet of natural gas each Games. Each host community will have a volunteer Environment Chair who will oversee the implementation of the Environmental Plan.
