## **Definitions**

- 1 In this regulation:
- "Act" means the *Teachers Act*;
- "applicant" means a person applying for a letter of permission under section 35 [issuance of letter of permission] of the Act;
- "prospective employer" means a board of education or an independent school authority that is considering becoming the employer of an applicant.

## Letters of permission

- 2 (1) An applicant must apply for a letter of permission in the form and manner required by the director of certification.
  - (2) An application may be jointly completed by an applicant and a prospective employer.
- (3) The director of certification may request the following information from a prospective employer, whether or not the application is made by the applicant or jointly by the applicant and the prospective employer:
  - (a) evidence that the prospective employer
    - (i) made reasonable efforts to hire a certificate holder for the position for which the applicant is being considered, and
    - (ii) was unable to recruit a certificate holder for the position;
  - (b) one of the following:
    - (i) confirmation that no certificate holder responded to an advertisement for the position for which the applicant is being considered;
    - (ii) a rationale for not hiring a certificate holder who responded to an advertisement for the position for which the applicant is being considered;
  - (c) a declaration by the prospective employer of the following:
    - (i) the prospective employer has no knowledge of any facts that would make the applicant an inappropriate person to work with children;
    - (ii) the prospective employer is satisfied that the applicant is of good character.
