


Dear LEH Hunter:

This letter is for hunters who received a Limited Entry Hunting (LEH) authorization for antierless mule deer in Management Units 7-20, 7-21, 7-35, 7-45, or 7-46.

The antlerless mule deer LEH was established to reduce impacts on agricultural crops on private land within the agricultural zone (Ag. Zone; generally, around Fort St. John and Dawson Creek). The antlerless LEH provides licensed hunting opportunities while maintaining management objectives based on population size, fawn survival/winter severity, and hunter success.

Following a recent Ag. Zone composition survey, mule deer were observed in densities that varied between management units (MUs), and as such we are in the process of refining the scale at which we manage antlerless mule deer harvest by issuing LEH authorizations at the MU level, rather than the broader Ag. Zone. This change will facilitate the distribution of hunting effort to better reflect mule deer population densities. The Ministry is requesting that successful applicants continue to focus their hunting efforts in agricultural areas within the MUs (see map on next page).
