On behalf of Yellowhead Community Services Society, I am pleased to provide the results of the small group discussion-participant engagement that was conducted through small group discussions and questionnaires to residents in Cache Creek, Ashcroft and Clinton. Small group discussions were held in Cache Creek at the Equality Project and in Ashcroft at the Hub Community Centre. In addition to group discussions, questionnaires were circulated in all communities, and as well, users of the Ashcroft-Clinton Transit System (which represents many low income individuals) completed questionnaires provided.

Dates of the sessions were March 19-Cache Creek; March 21-Ashcroft. The organizations who participated included; the Hub; Equality Project; Yellowhead Community Services Society; Ashcroft-Clinton Transit. About the Findings: Issues:

Key issues identified by participants included in order of priority:

- Inadequate income
- Improved access to medical services
- Improved access to mental health services
- Improved employment opportunities
- More affordable in rural communities

- Income assistance and PWD rates need to be increased and the ceiling for retaining income needs to be increased to help people get out of poverty
- More readily available to access services and/or seek employment

Possible Solutions:

The following represented solutions that were identified by the participants. They include:

- Improved access to medical services
- Affordable food
- Affordable housing
- Increase availability to public transportation
- Guaranteed annual income to remove poverty stigma
- Increase child care subsidy
- Increase shelter portion of income assistance
- Increase Persons with disability benefits
- Better employment opportunities

Solutions and Actions that can Make a Difference:

- Increase Housing Stock in rural areas
- Increase availability of affordable child care
- Subsidize food costs in rural areas

Top Three Solutions:

- 1. Increase health care services.
- 2. Develop subsidies to make food more affordable in rural isolated communities.
- 3. Increase availability of affordable housing.
