Switching to Orange Danger Tree Ribbon



Background: British Columbia Wildfire
Service has recently implemented a change
in the flagging tape colours used to mark
danger trees. Effective immediately,
Orange Danger Tree ribbon will
replace Yellow Danger Tree ribbon for
marking identified danger trees.

Safety Issue: Previously, both No Work Zones and danger trees had been marked with yellow flagging, which led to confusion. This created a safety concern, as workers would have to walk close to the marked area in order to distinguish

between the two different types of yellow ribbon being used.

Steps Taken: Moving forward, Yellow No Work Zone ribbon will be used to mark No Work Zones and Orange Danger Tree ribbon will be used to mark danger trees. This change has been made to create a safer work environment.

When using the new danger tree marking procedures, think of a traffic light:

- ✓ Orange Danger
- ✓ Yellow Caution
- ✓ Green Safe

During the transition to using Orange Danger Tree ribbon, both colours may be



used on incidents. It is vital that the colour that is being used is documented and communicated to all workers on the incident.
