The Location

Fort St. John is a city in northeastern BC, located at Mile 47 on the Alaska highway. Fort St. John describes itself as “The Energetic City” and is home to approximately 21,000 permanent residents. Fort St. John has daily scheduled flights to Edmonton, Calgary and Vancouver.
