## MOTORIZED VEHICLE RESTRICTION BY ORDER OF THE DISTRICT MANAGER, CLEARWATER FOREST DISTRICT, MINISTRY OF FORESTS

Upon the recommendation of the Clearwater Forest District Lakeshore Management Committee, I, Maxwell R. Tanner, District Manager, Clearwater Forest District, order that the areas identified as 'Walk-In Zones', associated with the lakes that are identified in Table A, all being located within and adjacent to Tree Farm Licence 18 west of Clearwater, and described by the Schedule 'A' maps (File 12560-20/FPC SEC 105), are closed to all unauthorized motor vehicles, including all terrain vehicles and snowmobiles, from January 1<sup>st</sup> to December 31<sup>st</sup>, annually. This order, made pursuant to Section 105(1) of the *Forest Practices Code of British Columbia Act*, is effective July 25, 2001, and remains in force until further notice.
