

- Time to update on BC Bid and provide the required instruction, resources and training for the new system ITT requirements.
- Want to thank you in advance for your time today and as we transition from the legacy BC Bid to the new system for ITTs!



BC Bid and MoTI

- CITZ implemented Phase 1.1 of the new BC Bid system on October 3, 2022.
- MoTI will NOT be using the new system for ITT until November 2, 2022, to ensure fulsome preparations are completed (buyer training, some vendor training, forms and tools updated).
- This training session is intended for suppliers that intend to submit bids for Ministry construction opportunities. For ITT training NOT RFQ/RFP.

Phase 1.1 Important MoTI Transition Information and Dates

- October 3, 2022 General CITZ ITT Functionality was made available
- November 1, 2022 Last MoTI ITT posting on Legacy BC Bid (must close before November 30, 2022)
- November 2, 2022 MoTI begins using the new system for posting NEW ITTs
- November 30, 2022 Last date for 'closing' ALL ITTs on Legacy BC Bid
- December 15, 2022 Cut-off for contract finalization on Legacy BC Bid
- December 16, 2022 Legacy BC Bid shut down users redirected to New BC Bid


CiTZ ITT Resources

Important Take-Aways

GENERAL

- MOTI will NOT be using the new system for ITTs until November 2, 2022.
- Reminder: Register for access to the New BC Bid.
- Must Join as a Planholder for each ITT to view the Tender and receive updates.
- Joint Ventures must submit bids manually.

TO SUBMIT AN ELECTRONIC BID:

- 1. Must Join as a Planholder for each ITT and have a BC Bid subscription
- 2. <u>Must</u> complete the new Response Form (e-bidder Tender Form)
- 3. <u>NEW</u> **May** Attach "e-Bid bond and verification" in the Response Form
- **4.** Must Complete Schedule 7 / Pricing Form &
- **5.** <u>Must</u> Review, Authenticate E-bid with BCEID, validate & send.

NEW & VERY IMPORTANT:

 Addenda is now Amendment and ALL amendments issued by MOTI to an ITT require Suppliers to resubmit their electronic Bid.

Important Take-Aways Cont'd

BID BOND Submission – Choose 1 of 3 Options & submit per Conditions of Tender

- 1. <u>NEW:</u> e-Bid Bond and verification, Response Form (e-bidder Tender Form) & Schedule 7 in one submission electronically in the New BC Bid application or
- 2. Submit e-Bid Bond to separate email address specified in the Tender for e-Bid Bond submissions only or
- 3. Submit an original hard copy Bid Bond by courier or hand delivery to the Closing Location for the specific Tender.
